

Procedures for field usage and the issuing of permits may change at anytime. All city leagues and special events will have field priority. The Edge of the Woods Garden Club will be busy in the off season planning for this year. We will have our regular meetings on Jan 5th and Feb 2nd at 7:00 at the city building. Hope to see you there. Winter is here and there's nothing to do in the garden so I thought I'd talk about bees. Bees are the main pollinators for the food we eat. Did you know that 1 of every 3 bites of food that we eat has been pollinated by bees or other pollinators? But the honey bee population is dying in this country. Scientists are not sure why but loss of habitat and use of pesticides are probably the main reasons. So what can we, as gardeners, do to help?

- Include pollinator plants in your garden to provide food and habitat!
- Limit use of pesticides. Only spray when necessary, seek expert advice, and follow label instructions exactly when or if you do.
- Provide sources of water, such as a birdbath or a water feature.

Snow Emergency

The City has an ordinance that prohibits all motor vehicles from parking on any street in the City during a Snow Emergency. A Snow Emergency may be declared by the Mayor anytime driving conditions are deemed hazardous. It is automatically in effect when there is a snowfall of two or more inches. We notify radio and television stations of declared Snow Emergencies, but they do not always broadcast the notice. These notices are not required and you may receive a citation without prior notification. Also, your car may be towed if it creates a hazard on your street. **Snow** Emergencies are put into effect for your safety as well as the City's. It allows the Public Works Department to plow and salt the thoroughfares without the additional hazard of parked vehicles. If it is snowing, or if snow is predicted, please remove your car(s) from the street. Let's all work together to keep our streets clear and safe for everyone. Happy Holidays!

I hope everyone had a great holiday. I've got a few safety tips for the winter season. Cooking, heating, holiday decorations and candles all contribute to an increased risk of fire during the winter months. Cooking and heating are by far, the leading causes of these fires. To ensure a fire safe winter season, it is important to be more attentive to the use of cooking materials and equipment, and make sure furnaces and chimneys are professionally cleaned and smoke alarms are properly maintained

Although the popularity of carbon monoxide (CO) alarms has been growing in recent years, it cannot be assumed that everyone is familiar with the hazards of carbon monoxide poisoning in the home. Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels (such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane) burn incompletely. In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel are potential sources of carbon monoxide. The only safe way to detect carbon monoxide in your home is with working carbon monoxide alarms. CO alarms are available at your local home improvement store and are easy to install. Be sure to place CO alarms on every level of your home and near sleeping areas to help keep your family safe. CO alarms should be replaced

every 5 to 7 years.
