

He did an excellent job. Good luck to you, Terry. We will continue to have an SRO officer in the Edgewood schools as we have had in the past few years.

Congratulations to the class of 2016 and all those who have supported them throughout the years. We support your time and efforts in this great accomplishment and wish you luck in the years ahead.

This year's Grand Marshal for the July 4th parade is our own City Clerk, Jeanette Kemper, who is celebrating 25 years of service to the city. We congratulate her on this outstanding accomplishment and look forward to having her continue to serve the city for many more years!

We have signed and awarded a contract with JPS Construction to perform the paving on the Edgewood / Lyndale road project. Weather permitting the work will begin this September starting at Dixie Highway. The streets will be concrete with rolled curbs. Edgewood road will have a sidewalk from Dixie Highway to Turkeyfoot road. Due to the cooperation between the Sanitation District, Water Department, the city and Duke Energy the project is projected to be completed 1 year earlier than expected. If we continue to work together and the weather cooperates we should complete the project earlier than estimated.

To date our online registration for the July 4th Edgewood/Tristate Running 5K are steadily coming in and we hope to meet or break last year's numbers for runners and walkers. Tristate Running has been a great help in jump starting the event each year. I hope you put your running or walking shoes on and join the crowd for the fun. FREE EYE SCREENINGS

Fireman Mike Says... by Firefighter Mike Constantino

Summer is the time to enjoy vacations, camping, picnics and Independence Day: however, summertime also brings fires and burn injuries due to fireworks and outdoor cooking. On July 4th in a typical year, far more U.S. fires are reported than on any other day, and fireworks account for 2 out of 5 of those fires, more than any other cause of fires. In 2013, U.S. hospital emergency rooms treated an estimated 11,400 people for fireworks related injuries; 55% of those injuries were to the extremities and 38% were to the head.

The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend public fireworks displays, leave the lighting to the professionals. The City of Edgewood provides this excitement on the holiday annually. Fireworks are designed to burn and explode. According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, daily hundreds of people on average go to the emergency room the weeks before and after the July 4th holiday. Fireworks are dangerous! Children between the ages of 10 and 14 are at the greatest risk of injury from fireworks.

Enjoy outdoor celebrations and cookouts but remember to keep a 3 foot "safe zone" around grills and campfires. Only use your grill outside and keep it away from siding and deck rails. Open your gas grills before lighting and keep an eye on your grill without leaving them unattended.

Knowing a few fire safety tips will help everyone have a safe summer. Stay safe, stay hydrated and we can't wait to see you at the July 4th parade!

PLEASE WATCH FOR PEDESTRIANS IN CROSSWALKS

With the summer months upon us the city is asking drivers to be extra vigilant of pedestrians, children, bikers, etc. in crosswalks. Please see the below ordinance in regards to pedestrian right of way: (KRS 189.570 (12), (13), (14))

(B) Driver to exercise due care. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions herein, every driver of a vehicle shall exercise due care to avoid colliding with any pedestrian upon any roadway, shall give warning by sounding the horn when necessary. and shall exercise proper precaution upon observing any child or any confused or incapacitated person upon a roadway.

(KRS 189.570 (6) (d))

(C) Penalty. Whoever violates any provision of this section shall, upon conviction, be subject to a minimum fine of \$20.00 as set forth in KRS 189.990 (1), and a maximum fine as set forth in \$70.99.

RUMPKE TRASH & RECYCLING

Rumpke trash information – residents can have two 95 gallon containers or one 95 gallon container and up to three (3) additional bags per trash pickup. Yard waste – if it doesn't fit in the trash container then it must be bundled in three foot sections in order for Rumpke to take it. If residents have larger items to dispose of such as furniture, residents must call Rumpke in advance at 859-472-7339 to arrange pick up. Mattresses and upholstered furniture must be wrapped in plastic before setting out to the curb.
