Rumpke Trash & Recycling

Rumpke trash information – residents can have two 95 gallon containers or one 95 gallon container and up to three (3) additional bags per trash pickup. Yard waste – if it doesn't fit in the trash container then it must be bundled in three foot sections in order for Rumpke to take it. If residents have larger items to dispose of such as furniture, residents must call Rumpke in advance at 859-472-7339 to arrange pick up. Mattresses and upholstered furniture must be wrapped in plastic before setting out to the curb.

Congratulations to the Class of 2017 and to all those who had supported them throughout the years. We all wish you the best for the coming years.

For the last few years we have provided our residents a notification service known as Reach Alert at www.reachalert.com that will notify you of emergencies, park events, crime alerts, road closures, and other city announcements, all free of charge which has been a real asset for those who have signed up for this notification. It works!

We now have a new application for our residents to submit issues related to our city. The app is called "Edgewood Engage" provided by SeeClickFix where issues can be submitted by a phone app, desktop computer, or by calling the city building and we will submit the issue. Once the issue is submitted, it goes directly to the staff member assigned to address the issue. This issue request can be followed on the app or computer to see the status of this issue. This creates a transparent viewing from start to finish for those issues as well as a great tracking system for us all. We have just started this program and we are still working out the kinks but go ahead and send your issues. Search the App Store for SeeClickFix Edgewood Engage.

Our Edgewood and Lyndale road project is in its final stages of construction and with some dry days, we should be completed in late July. This will be ahead of schedule but final grading and seeding will take some additional time. We appreciate everyone's patience during this construction, but I'm sure the results will speak for themselves.

The Dudley road construction from Winding Trails to Catherine Drive is still scheduled to go out for bid this fall with construction starting in 2018. Dudley will have curbs on the sidewalk side and new pavement will be installed as our phase 1 project.

You may have noticed a new red wooden structure at the entrance to the shelter across the street from the Edgewood Deli. It was installed by the R.C. Hinsdale wise team as the Little Free Library, "Take a Book, Read a Book" which is just another way to get more interest in reading and connecting with books. Thank you to the R.C. Hinsdale staff.



summertime also brings fires and burn injuries due to fireworks and outdoor cooking. On July 4th in a typical year, far more U.S. fires are reported than on any other day, and fireworks account for 2 out of 5 of those fires, more than any other cause of fires.

The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend public fireworks displays, leave the lighting to the professionals. The City of Edgewood provides this excitement on the holiday annually. Fireworks are designed to burn and explode. According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, daily hundreds of people on average go to the emergency room the weeks before and after the July 4th holiday. Fireworks are dangerous! Children between the ages of 10 and 14 are at the greatest risk of injury from fireworks.

Enjoy outdoor celebrations and cookouts but remember to keep a 3 foot "safe zone" around grills and campfires. Only use your grill outside and keep it away from siding and deck rails. Open your gas grills before lighting and keep an eye on your grill without leaving them unattended.

Knowing a few fire safety tips will help everyone have a safe summer. Stay safe, stay hydrated and we can't wait to see you at the July 4th parade!
