The Dudley Road project from Winding Trails to 3L Highway is not completely finished but it is now open for traffic throughout the winter. The contractor has put down a rough coat of asphalt to make this movement possible until early spring when the final finish coat will be applied. When the weather breaks in the spring we will begin work on the lower portion from Sperti Drive to 3L Highway and complete the sidewalk areas. The contractor has now advised us that in spring 2015 we may need to close the roadway and possible delays may occur until they have completed all sections. Caution should be taken while traveling this section of road, although open to traffic there are areas of uneven pavement and is still an area under construction.

Fireman Mike Says... by Firefighter Mike Constantino



fires are more prevalent during the winter months and according to the U.S. Fire Administration (USFA), it's estimated over 100,000 winter residential building fires occur each year in the United States. Cooking and heating are by far, the leading causes of these fires. With colder temperatures, people spend more time indoors and resort to using fireplaces, space heaters and alternative heating methods such as cooking stoves to keep warm. To ensure a fire safe winter season, it is important to be more attentive to the use of cooking materials and equipment, and make sure furnaces and chimneys are professionally cleaned and smoke alarms are properly maintained.

Many residents are unaware of the potential threat that carbon monoxide (CO) poses in their homes. Called the "silent killer." carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless and tasteless gas that can be deadly. It is produced any time fuel is burned and may come from common household appliances, such

as gas stoves, water heaters and fireplaces. When appliances are not properly installed or maintained, they may malfunction and cause CO to seep into the home. Because carbon monoxide has no smell or taste and the initial poisoning symptoms often mimic the flu (headache and nausea), victims may be unaware they are being exposed. The only safe way to detect carbon monoxide in

and are easy to install. Be sure to place CO alarms on every level of your home and near sleeping areas to help keep your family safe. CO alarms should be replaced every 5 to 7 years. If you don't know how old your alarms are, you should replace them today!

90.17 Restraint Required-All dog owners shall restrain any and all dogs on a leash or confine them within a fence or other enclosure, so that the dog is restricted and separated from adjoining neighbors and the general public. 90.16 License Required-No dog owner shall allow any dog to be present within the city unless such a dog is licensed according to the statures of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and ordinances of Kenton County.

Pooper Scooper Law-Nobody shall cause, permit, allow, aid, assist, encourage or engage in the use of any real estate of another, public or private, for any defecation thereon, by any dog or cat, within the ownership, custody or control thereof. The owner and custodian of any dog or cat which defecates upon any real estate of another, public, private, shall have the duty, obligation and responsibility of immediately removing such defecation there from, and causing the disposition thereof, according to law. Conviction of violation carries a fine of \$500 and/or imprisonment not to exceed 12 months.

The City of Edgewood has laws regulating "domestic animals": 90.02 Animals Running At Large-No person who is the owner of any animal shall permit it to run at large in any public road, highway, street, lane or alley, or upon unenclosed land, or permit it to go on any private yard, lot, or enclosure without the consent of the owner of the yard, lot or enclosure.
