**Mayor's Report** – Mayor Link attended the Municipal Government League meeting where Representative Sal Santoro discussed statewide collections of the occupational tax. He supports the bill; it has been voted down twice and will be voted on again soon. Discussion will continue at the next MGLNK meeting being held at the Edgewood Senior Center on May 20<sup>th</sup> 6 p.m. Representative Santoro and others from Lexington and Louisville will be in attendance. Northern KY is not supportive of the State collecting the tax.

Mayor Link thanked the public works department for installing the sidewalk along Medical Village Drive; it will continue on South Loop Road.

**Administrator's Report** – none.

**Staff Reports** – Council reviewed reports from the following staff members: City Administrator, City Clerk, Fire/EMS, General Services, Police, and Recreation. Mr. Messmer asked how the reduction in ALS will affect us; will Erlanger send an ambulance if a second paramedic is needed. Tom Dickman said with the mutual aid agreement, yes, they will send Rural Metro (formally Transcare) if needed; they will be our backup.
