

**CITY OF EDGEWOOD
COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
October 18, 2010
6:30 PM**

CALL TO ORDER – Mayor Link called the meeting of the Edgewood City Council to order at 6:30 PM in the council chambers of the Edgewood City Building. The following council members were present: Jeff Schreiber, Chris Link, Dale Henson, Steve Jaeger, Joe Messmer, and Ray Spears. Also in attendance were City Attorney Frank Wichmann, City Administrator Roger Rolfes and City Clerk Jeanette Kemper.

INVOCATION

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

APPROVAL OF AGENDA – Mr. Messmer added “Signs” under New Business.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – October 4, 2010 Meeting Minutes – Mr. Spears made a **motion** to adopt the October 4, 2010 meeting minutes as written; second by Mr. Messmer. Mr. Jaeger abstained. **Motion passed: 6 ayes – 1 abstention.**

REPORT/PRESENTATIONS

Mayor’s Report – Mayor Link advised that the NKAPC fall meeting is on October 27th at Twin Oaks, reservations are due October 25th. We hosted the Mayor’s Group Meeting last Saturday, discussion was held on possible water and sewer rate increases. DARE graduation for St. Pius will be November 17th at 7 p.m. and Hinsdale’s will be November 30th at 6 p.m. Mayor Link said the city does not advertise politically on the city’s marquee sign; we received requests to advertise different political events on the sign but we do not endorse parties, events and candidates. We also will not put this information in the city newsletter either.

Administrator’s Report – Mr. Rolfes added to Mayor Link’s above statement that if someone rents the Senior Center they are entitled to put their name/event on that marquee sign.

CITIZENS DESIRING RECOGNITION ON LEGISLATIVE MATTERS NOT ON THE AGENDA – none

UNFINISHED BUSINESS – **Dudley Road Project** from Winding Trails to KY 17 – Mayor Link introduced Hank Fedders, KZF Design, city engineer. Mr. Fedders discussed how they were going fix Dudley hill to help alleviate safety and water concerns. There will no longer be drop offs; they’re installing curb and gutter on both sides of the road along with a sidewalk. A new storm drainage system will be installed as well. There will be a 9” high barrier curb installed on the right side going down the hill in the first curve; guard rail will be put in by Henn’s property. An information meeting was held with the affected property owners recently; some were concerned about a site distance issue as they come up the hill and turn left into their driveways, this issue will be resolved by cutting into the hillside another 6 ft. with a drilled shaft wall to provide a 250 ft. site distance that is required. This will be bid as an alternate to the project; estimate is \$75,000-100,000. Some of the dips in the road will be taken out; the pitches will be corrected too.

Mr. Schreiber reaffirmed that the section of Dudley from Sperti Drive to KY 17 would be concrete and not asphalt; Mr. Fedders said yes it would be.

Mr. Messmer asked if it would be possible to take the section of road before the curve in front of Henn 2ft to the north and then on this side of Henn’s property line go to 2 ft to the south to take that curve out of there and it would help enhance the safety in front of Henn’s. Mr. Fedders said they are widening the road in that area on the other side of Henn’s, a sidewalk is going in as well as a guardrail.

The road will not be open to through traffic during construction; they're working on a plan but there will probably be a detour through Horsebranch Road.

Hope to bid the project early 2011 and have it finished by November 1, 2011.

NEW BUSINESS – Approve Summit repair to ladder bracket on Truck 160 – Mrs. Atkinson made a **motion** to approve the repair to the ladder bracket on Truck 160 from Summit Fire Apparatus at the cost of \$85 because the item serviced is in the best interest of the public and the city due to convenience; second by Mr. Jaeger. Mr. Messmer abstained. **Motion passed: 6 ayes – 1 abstention.**

Signs – Mr. Messmer asked if a “no outlet” sign could be installed on Sperti Drive just past the Thornton’s entrance to keep people from turning around at the end of that road which dead ends in his business parking lot. It was suggested to also add a “no turn around” sign. The sign/s will be installed.


ORDINANCES, MUNICIPAL ORDERS, AND RESOLUTIONS – Ordinance 2010-10-07 adopt 2006 International Property Maintenance Code – 2nd reading. Mr. Wichmann read the ordinance: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF EDGEWOOD, IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, MAKING THE 2006 INTERNATIONAL PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE A PART OF THE PERMANENT RECORDS OF THE CITY, AND ADOPTING THE PROVISIONS THEREOF BY REFERENCE, and WITH CERTAIN AMENDMENTS AND REVISIONS. Mr. Henson made a **motion** to adopt ordinance 2010-10-07; second by Mr. Spears. **Motion passed: 7 ayes – 0 nays.**

ANNOUNCEMENTS


