

I'd like to thank all the residents that took the time to fill out our survey and mail it back to Northern Kentucky University. They are in the process of evaluating your responses.

We should have all the results in our next newsletter. If you just found your survey in a stack of leftover mail on the counter, you can still fill it out and bring it to the city building and we will include it in the results.

With Memorial Day and the 4th of July events forthcoming a few residents have asked if we still have pavers and bricks available. Yes, we do and if you would like to leave some history in stone please contact the administrative office for costs and locations. It's a great way to thank a family member or to recognize the entire family.

Our public works staff and city engineer have traveled all the streets in the city to determine their condition. We will compile the data and rankings of what streets need to be repaired or replaced. We should have the list in June and major construction will begin in early July. With this street work ahead of us you can expect some delays so if your street is affected, please leave a few minutes early to avoid the delays.

Many of you may have heard, we are offering, through the National League of Cities, a free prescription card. The card can be used at any drug store or discount store for those prescriptions that are not covered by your insurance. This discount is a 20 percent savings to you or any of your family members and can be picked up in the lobby of our city building.
