

FIREMAN JOE SAYS BY FIREMAN JOE STAMBUSH

I hope everyone had a great summer and now with the fall season comes Fire Prevention Month. This year's theme is "Stay Fire Smart! Don't Get Burned" and is geared towards a continuing problem of fire prevention in our homes. Fireman Joe will be visiting the schools

and communities promoting fire prevention and discussing facts about the leading causes of fires in the home. You have heard these home safety tips many times but I must never grow tired of mentioning such things as cooking safety, which continues to be the leading cause of home fires and injuries. An interesting statistic on smoking, did you know one out of four victims of fatal smoking fires is not the smoker whose cigarette started the fire. On average, there are more than 21,200 electrical and lighting home fires each year, resulting in 370 deaths. A sad fact is the amount of intentional fires that are started each year, it is important to keep a watchful eye on your neighborhood. Heating is the second leading cause of fire deaths, keep those furnaces and chimneys clean and never forget Space Heaters Need Space. The most common types of burn injuries are fire/flame burns, scalds, and contact burns. Burns are painful and can result in serious scarring and even deaths. Fireman Joe is always available to offer tours of the firehouse, presentations to your church or social groups, scouts, clubs and any senior group.
