The way the weather has been going, I guess I can say the snow is over, but our planning for next year is just now gearing up. As the snow lingered on the sidewalks it made it difficult to navigate for those that needed to walk or would like to just get out and stroll, so with this in mind, next year once the snow has stopped falling we will plow the Freedom Park trail. It will give you the parking you need and we will be able to maintain it for easy and safe walking or jogging.

Over a year ago we offered a free prescription card to our residents that had a 20 percent savings if your insurance company did not cover some or all of your prescription. I'm pleased to say over 411 residents have taken and used this offer and had a savings of \$13,080.28 to date. If you have not gotten one and would like to get one, just stop at the city building and pick one up.

By now most of us have received the 2010 census forms. I found it had just enough questions to get me in that 10 to 15 minute completion timeframe. If you have a problem in filling out the form our staff at the city building is ready and able to help you. So if you have problems count on us for "Everyone Counts".

Just another reminder Edgewood's Fourth of July celebration will be on Saturday, July 3rd with the race in the morning and the fireworks in the evening. Get your neighborhood float together and join us in the parade.

Many thanks to all those who stuffed the 6,000 Easter eggs for the annual egg hunt. We had and will now continue to host this event at Freedom Park and the Senior Center so if the weather is not in our favor we can go inside or stay outside as we did this year. This is one of the fastest events we have; it starts at 2:00 p.m. and is over at 2:02 p.m. Thanks for every ones help.

With the weather starting to improve our public works department has begun to fill pot holes. They have also started to work on those streets they were not able to complete earlier this year. Our new list of street repairs should be out in late May or early June once we complete our street assessment. Our Dudley hill project from Winding Trails to 3L is still moving along with soil samples taken last week. It looks like we could get started in 2011. We will keep you updated as we go.

Thanks to our Fire/EMS and all of the volunteers that work so hard in making our annual fish fry a huge success. Of course, we would like to thank each and every one of our residents, friends and relatives that supported us throughout the season. Many of our Friday evening residents enjoyed the round table discussions that build our community. A note from your Fire and EMS Department ...

FIREMAN JOE SAYS:

Outdoor fires can cover hundreds of acres and burn for days. They can destroy everything in their paths and it can take hundreds of firefighters to put them out. Forest fires, field fires and general fires in the woods can be sparked by lightning, but most often by people being careless.

If you go camping, see if there are any rules about campfires in the area. Be sure to clear the surrounding area of brush before you start it. Never use lighter fluid or gasoline to start a fire use kindling wood. Never leave any fire unattended or take burning sticks out of the fire. Be sure to have plenty of water or a source of extinguishment near by. If using an outdoor lantern or stove, keep it away from things that burn and never bring a grill or charcoal fire inside a tent or confined space. If a wild fire should start, get away guickly and safely. Report it to the fire dept or authorities (Ranger) if camping or a local emergency responder. I also suggest putting the fire out completely before going to bed or leaving your campsite. Use water and then put dirt on top. It goes without saying always keep small children away from any fire source.
