CY OF EDGEWOOD

Many of you might have read in the newspaper that our police department now has a secure, metal, prescription drop box mounted in their entrance to the city building. If you have unused or unwanted prescription drugs, you may dispose of them in the box.

The Dudley hill project is still on the drawing boards; we hope it will be released in early 2011. The project is from Winding Trails to 3L Highway and includes sidewalks, curbs, and street lighting. Once we get everything together, we will be able to set construction

The connector sidewalk from Dudley to the Crestview Hills Towne Center along Dixie Highway is still scheduled for early 2011. Crestview Hills is coordinating this project. It will provide for a safe walk to the Towne Center from the Edgewood side of the road.

I want to thank Roger Rolfes and staff, for putting together a SNK Grant that will improve Dudley Road from Winding Trails to Dixie Highway. The project calls for a 1.2 million dollar reconstruction and upgrading of Dudley. The Grant was approved on August 12 by the OKI Regional Council and will start in 2011 and 2012. Along with this approval we were also awarded \$50,000 to upgrade eight traffic and pedestrian signals in Edgewood. Thanks to all for this great savings!

The concerts in the park came to a close, as well as, the Shakespeare in the Park evening. If you were not able to attend any of the performances, I hope you will try to next year.

I presented the 2011-2012 Budget to Council and once again, there will be no tax increase for the coming year. Please look at your insurance bills and make sure you are not charged a city tax. We do not have an insurance tax on your car, health or property.

Just a reminder with the holiday season forthcoming, we sell postage stamps at the city building. You also can drop off mail in the box outside our building. Use us and save time spent standing in line at the Post Office.

Please join us at our Edgewood's "Fabulously Fun Day" at Presidents Park on Saturday, September 25. The event will include a pet show, games, food, inflatables, and entertainment. It will be a great day of fun!

Hope to see you at one or more of the up and coming events.



Yoga/Pilates classes will be offered at the senior center on Monday and Thursday evenings at 6 p.m. The classes begin on Thursday, September 9






Halpin-Poweleit Eye Center, a division of Tri-State Centers for Sight has provided general ophthalmology care to Tri-State residents for the past 28 years. Their office is offering a Free Vision Screening at the Edgewood Senior Center on September 28th at 11:00 am. We will have a sign-in sheet and will see people on a first come first serve basis. Trained ophthalmic technicians will provide visual acuities for distance and near, and intraocular pressure (glaucoma screening). They will also provide education on eye care including cataracts, glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy, and macular degeneration. The screening will take about 10 minutes and will NOT require having your eyes dilated. If you wear eyeglasses please bring them to the screening so we can test your best corrected vision. We look forward to providing you with your vision needs!

FOLLOW SOCIAL SECURITY ON FACEBOOK AND TWITTER


