After the last newsletter, we had a number of inquiries concerning the 1.6 million dollar grant we received from the OKI Council for road improvements to Dudley Road to Dixie Highway. The changes that will take place will be new asphalt, pavement markers and better water drainage on the road surface. There will be no changes in width or any other major changes. This work is scheduled for 2011-2012. The other major Dudley Road project from Winding Trials to 3L Highway should get started in the spring of 2011.

We had our first meeting with the residents and business owners last month; some minor changes were requested and are being addressed.

Roger Rolfes, who has been my CAO for the last 11 years, announced he will retire as of January 1, 2011. We are currently advertising for this position and hope to have his replacement by or before December 1. SNOW EMERGENCY

The City has an ordinance that prohibits all motor vehicles from parking on any street in the City during a Snow Emergency. A Snow Emergency may be declared by the Mayor anytime driving conditions are deemed hazardous. It is automatically in effect when there is a snowfall of two or more inches. We notify radio and television stations of declared Snow Emergencies, but they do not always broadcast the notice. These notices are not required and you may receive a citation without prior notification. Also, your car may be towed if it creates a hazard on your street. Snow Emergencies are put into effect for your safety as well as the City's. It allows the Public Works Department to plow and salt the thoroughfares without the additional hazard of parked vehicles. If it is snowing, or if snow is predicted, please remove your car(s) from the
