The new truck will replace truck #160 which was purchased used from the Dade County, Florida Fire Department in 1984 and was re-furbished; some parts of #160 were 37 years old. In the good ole summer time, with all the rain we have been having the last few months I am ready for some good summer weather and lots of summer activities. When those hot summer days come be sure that everyone is aware of summer sun prevention and terms like heat wave-heat index-heat cramps and heat exhaustion to name a few. My best advice

is to drink water regularly even if you are not thirsty, take time off for breaks, lunch, snacks and lots of rest. Take a cool shower or bath, if you decide to take a swim follow all the water safety rules like, never swim alone or without supervision, check depth and know the site. Avoid exertion during the hottest part of the day. Never leave children or pets alone in the car, even for just a moment, things happen and what seems like a moment can go to five or ten minutes and disaster. Wear sunscreen outside, along with light-colored clothes that cover as much skin as possible. Stay indoors in air conditioning as much as possible during a heat wave and in the shade if you go outside. 2011-2012 STREET REHABILITATION AND **IMPROVEMENTS** by General Services Director **Stan Goetz**

The following streets are scheduled for concrete replacement: Colony Dr, Magnolia Ct, Marcel Dr, Glen Arbor, Coachlight and Timber Ridge to Trailwood.
