Children between the ages of 10 and 14 are at greatest risk of injury from fireworks. In 2010, 73 percent of fireworks injuries occurred between June 18 and July 18. Summertime should be a time for fun and making happy memories. Knowing a few fire safety tips will help everyone have a safe summer.
