Much has been written and discussed about the 911 parcel fee that has been approved by the Fiscal Court to consolidate the dispatch centers in the near future to save us, the taxpayers, from unnecessary tax increases. Presently our contract is with Erlanger dispatch and our revenue comes from the \$4.26 fee on landline phones to cover the cost for this service. Effective January 1, 2013, we will have asked that this fee to be taken off the phone landline bills for the City of Edgewood. The parcel fee that was adopted by the Fiscal Court will be applied as our payment. The Fiscal Court has assured us this will happen and once the County dispatch system can handle our call loads and the system is equal to or better than what we have today, Edgewood will join the County system. Let me reassure our residents that your calls for help when in need will not go unattended and our services will continue to excel with either of these centers. There will be no interruption in service. I will say, all of our cities in Kenton County, are committed to work together to make this system the best and most cost effective even if we have to look at other revenue sources in the near future. Our time frame for joining the county dispatch is tentatively set for October 2013. We ask all of our citizens to be aware that the dynamics of this issue are continuing to evolve, and we will ensure that Edgewood's emergency services continue to respond to emergencies in the professional manner we have all come to expect.

All of last year's street repairs and replacements are completed and we are now beginning to work on this year's schedule. We should get some done this fall if the weather is in our favor, but the majority will be finished in early spring and summer 2013. Our city crews are still out fixing the minor repairs to those streets in need and will continue as long as they can. The Dudley road project from Winding Trails to Brookwood is in the final stages of getting all the easements in writing to meet the State's requirements. With that said, we should see contracts and work beginning in 2013. With the new designed curbs, lighting and pavement this should cut down on the accidents we have been seeing most recently. We can make all these improvements going down the hill but speed, light weight cars and wet pavement have been the major concerns. Please use care going down the Dudley Hill section.

With the holiday season approaching, we are again having the annual tree lighting on November 25 at the Senior Center starting at 5:30 pm and Santa and Mrs. Claus will arrive about 6:00 pm. Again this year, we will have the hot wheels event and if you do not have a hot wheel, one will be provided for your use. Bring your camera to take your favorite picture that you will remember for years to come.



I'd like to thank and welcome all of our new residents that have chosen Edgewood as your new home. We are glad you are here and hope to see you at one or more of the coming events. Have a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

a 3 foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters. Never use your oven to heat your home. Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a gualified professional. Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed. Test smoke detectors often. Another common fire hazard occurs in the kitchen. Never leave food unattended that is cooking on the stove. Also, holiday lights can be a danger in the home. Inspect holiday lights for frayed wires, bare spots, or excessive wear before putting them up. Use only lighting listed by an approved testing laboratory. Do not link more than 3 light strands, unless the directions indicate it is safe. Connect strings of lights to an extension cord before plugging the cord into the outlet. Make sure to periodically check the wires - they should not be warm to the touch. And last but not least, never go near a Christmas tree with and open flame - candles, lighters or matches. Please practice fire safety so that we can all enjoy the holidays. Edgewood FIRE/EMS wishes each of you a Happy Holiday Season!

SNOW EMERGENCY

The City of Edgewood has an ordinance that prohibits all motor vehicles from parking on any street in the City during a Snow Emergency. A Snow Emergency may be declared by the Mayor anytime driving conditions are deemed hazardous. It is automatically in effect when there is snow fall of two or more inches. We notify radio and television stations of declared Snow Emergencies, but they do not always broadcast the notice. These notices are not required and you may receive a citation without prior notification. Also, your car may be towed if it creates a hazard on your street. Snow Emergencies are put into effect for your safety as well as the City's. It allows the Public Works Department to plow and salt the thoroughfares without the additional hazards of parked vehicles. If it is snowing, or if snow is predicted, please remove your car(s) from the street.

Just a reminder, if you would like to advantage of the 1.25% discount, your tax bill must be postmarked by November 30.

Christmas trees with wires or bags may be dropped off for pick -up by January 14th at the designated areas in both Presidents and Freedom parks. The Kenton County Public Works Department will pick-up the trees and mulch them.
