

## Historic Cancer Research Effort Being Done Through American Cancer Society, St. Elizabeth Healthcare

St. Elizabeth Healthcare in Edgewood is partnering with the American Cancer Society to provide a historic study to the region that has the potential to change the face of cancer for future generations. The American Cancer Society's Cancer Prevention Study-3 (CPS-3) will be conducted through St. Elizabeth Healthcare in Edgewood (Rooms L and M) during Thursday, April 18, from 3-6:30 p.m., and Friday, April 19, from 7-10:30 a.m.

Those eligible are men and women, ages 30-65, who have not had a prior cancer diagnosis, and who are willing to be part of a 20-30 year study. The study also involves a baseline medical history, follow-up surveys, a waist measurement and small blood draw at the time of enrollment.

Eligible participants are encouraged to go online to <a href="www.cps3noky.org">www.cps3noky.org</a> schedule an appointment date and time now.

Previous Cancer Prevention Studies have played a major role in understanding cancer prevention and risk. Those studies confirmed the link between cigarette smoking and lung cancer, and demonstrated the link between larger waist size and increased death rates from cancer and other causes. CPS-3 will help researchers better understand the lifestyle, environmental, and genetic factors that cause or prevent cancer.

Did you know that in the 1880s Dudley Pike from Kentucky 17 to the top of the hill was a toll road? The toll house was located mid-way up the hill approximately where the small one-room house is now. For those who did not want to pay that toll they would come up Horsebranch to a point on Dudley near the present day Prestwicke via a much more rural connector road that is long gone. As people debate about the Brent Spence Bridge and the potential for tolls, it is interesting to think that they were once quite common all around our area. ## Fireman Mike Says... by Firefighter Mike Constantino



Let me start by reminding you that Daylight Savings Time began on Sunday, March 10th. While you were changing your clocks one hour ahead, be sure to change the battery in your smoke detectors too! Also check the date on the smoke detector to see if it has expired. Most smoke detectors are good for 10 years so replace if needed.

As part of spring cleaning make sure to take a few minutes to clean up and brush off your safety plans as well:

- Remove all hazards.
- Clean-up work areas. Put dangerous tools, adhesives, matches or other work items away and out of any child's reach.
- Check fire protection and safety equipment. Make sure all doors and windows open easily and are accessible for quick escapes.
- Make sure your street numbers are posted properly and are visible.
- Practice your escape plan. Even the best plan is no good if it's not practiced.
