



MAYOR'S REPORT

2006 was a good year for us; it was the first time in the city's history we were able to come together as a unit with the move into the new city building. The weather has also been on our side, but we could end up paying for it in March or April. Let's hope not!

With the good weather we were able to start some additional street repairs, but the major repairs on Brookwood Circle have now been delayed until the spring due to the utility company's repairs and modification. Our Public Works Department is currently making up the new list of streets that will need to be repaired or replaced and will advise us in the coming months.

Recently, we were approached by the concrete association offering to donate all of the pervious concrete needed for the parking lot adjacent to the city building. A demonstration was given to all the contractors in the Cincinnati area showing that this new concrete has a big advantage in helping prevent water runoff which could lead to flooding. You can take a bucket of water and pour it on the concrete and the water will be absorbed into the concrete and into the soil below. In conjunction with the lot addition, Mr. Adam Rigsby, an Edgewood resident, is working toward his Eagle Scout badge and has offered to construct a gazebo in the front area of the lot. Adam is currently soliciting donations for lumber, nails, and roofing materials to build this gazebo. Adam wanted to do this community building project and get the entire community to help one way or another so everyone could look back in the years to come and be proud of the project. I'd like to welcome Ken Scheben, our newest public works employee, who brings to us many years of experience and will be working on the new streets with us as well as the day to day operations.

The Christmas Tree Lighting had the largest crowd we have ever had and the chili contest hit a new record with 13 entries. Thanks to all who shared their special recipes with us; it was an enjoyable evening.

SPRING FIELD RESERVATIONS

Anyone interested in reserving a field for the spring of 2007 should submit a written request to Kim Wolking at 385 Dudley Road, by February 15th. The request should include the coach's complete address, including work, home and cell phone numbers, day of week needed, time of day, anticipated number of weeks needed, starting date, league and age of players, complete rosters with addresses and the field name you are requesting. Permits will be issued the first part of March. Procedures for field usage and the issuing of permits may change at anytime. All city leagues and special events will have field priority.

FIREMAN JOE SAYS: HAPPY NEW YEAR!

May 2007 be prosperous and successful for all of us.

I'm proud to work with the Edgewood Fire Department and look forward to many exciting and helpful projects in 2007. With colder weather approaching and heating costs continuing to skyrocket, I have asked the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) to offer some simple ways to save energy and keep us and our families safe and warm. They have offered these suggestions:

HEATING SYSTEMS: Set thermostats at 68 degrees when the house is occupied during the day and then turn it down at night or when you're not home. Make sure supply and return vents, radiators and baseboard heating units are not obstructed by furniture, appliances or other objects and that air can flow freely to and from them. Clean or change furnace filters in forced hot air systems once a month or more often as needed. Check heating ducts for air leaks from joints and holes. Insulate your hot water tank with an insulating jacket according to manufacturer recommendations.



WINDOWS & DOORS: Install caulking, weather stripping or use spray-in foams around exterior windows and doors or those between heated and unheated spaces. Keep draperies and shades open during the day and keep closed at night to reduce heat loss.

FIRE SAFETY TIPS: Make sure that space heaters have space - keep or maintain a 36 inch clearance between all heating equipment and anything that can burn.

DO NOT USE AN OVEN TO HEAT YOUR HOME!!!! Have wood and coal stoves, fireplaces, chimneys, chimney connectors and all other solid fueled heating equipment inspected annually by a professional, and cleaned as often as inspections suggest. If the power is out, avoid

using candles, use flashlights. Speaking of candles, never leave a burning candle unattended, blow it out if you leave the room, the house or go to bed. Test smoke alarms monthly and maintain a carbon monoxide alarm in a central location outside each sleeping area. Remember, smoke is lighter than air and will rise while CO is heavier than air and will lay low then rise. Smoke detectors are available at the fire house at no charge with batteries.
