FIREMAN JOE SAYS:

The tragic events this past month in Bardstown, Ky remind us of the need to review our home escape plans and ensure working smoke detectors. Although 90% of all residences have smoke alarms today, 74% of home fire deaths result from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms. Working smoke alarms

do save lives but are just tools in the escape process. We must all create and practice home escape plans. Know how you and your family will react before a fire. Incredible, the one place we are supposed to feel most safe, our homes, is the very place where more fires occur than anywhere else, at least 99% of all structure fire deaths in Kentucky occur in private residences. In the past couple of months, I have had the pleasure to meet with and provide home safety surveys for several of our residents. During these surveys we recommend and offer suggestive prevention materials to assist with home escape plans, proper detector



placement and offer safety tips to keep everyone safe at home. We can provide smoke detectors, batteries and suggest a good carbon monoxide detector in the home. Fireman Joe's duty day at the fire station is on Monday and Wednesdays but our duty crew personnel are always available to answer questions or check for any problem in the home.
