Hello and Hurray! The day has finally arrived. I'm happy to report we have moved in and are working in our new building and offices. I'm elated to be working in such a magnificent facility; it has taken a while to get settled but things are going well. I'm looking forward to continuing and expanding our fire and life safety programs for our great community.

With the coming of spring comes the unsettled weather conditions and often these weather changes can occur without a lot of warning. Just remember to always stay informed and prepared for thunderstorms that can turn severe with hail and high winds; often tornadoes can be produced from these unstable conditions. You've heard this many times but know the difference; a watch whether it is a severe storm watch or a tornado watch means conditions are favorable for severe weather or a

tornado. A warning means it's imminent and take shelter immediately, a tornado or severe thunderstorm is on the way. I suggest watching your local television station or listen to your radio for information and instructions. If outdoors seek refuge low to the ground but not under a tree or pole. If indoors go to the basement or close to weight bearing walls, stay away from windows and doors, consider having blinds pulled over the windows or curtains which will help shield you from flying glass. I think a great idea is to have a kit prepared in the basement or somewhere in the house containing fresh water, a flashlight, snacks, a radio with extra batteries, and an activity like a game or books to keep young minds occupied.
