Even though we had a mild winter our streets took a major hit. Our public works department is continuing to fill and patch holes. We currently take care of 52 miles of streets that are in the city limits. Our public works director and our staff engineer are compiling a list of streets that need to be upgraded and/or replaced. We should have this list by the next newsletter for everyone to review. The repairs and upgrade on Brookwood Circle will be ongoing until mid summer; those using Brookwood Circle to go to Brookwood Drive and Kinsella should take another route to get to Dudley Road. Detour signs are posted by the contractor in those areas; plan to have a little delay or to take another route.

As nice as the weather has been many are walking the "friendly mile" along Dudley Road and stopping at the new gazebo. Last week we noticed a couple having lunch before heading to Presidents Park. We again are grateful to Eagle Scout Adam Rigsby for constructing the gazebo and our public works department for putting the final touches on the surrounding area. Each year, disasters, including floods, tornadoes, wildfires, earthquakes, blizzards, and extreme heat, affect thousands of Americans. We must always be on guard for intentional disasters such as terrorism. A disaster can strike anytime, anywhere. Every community in each state has the potential for a disaster, leaving no citizen immune from the possibility of experiencing such an event.

Disasters may give little or no warning. Sometimes people are fortunate enough to have time to prepare and



take appropriate actions. Often, however, you will have no time to do anything more than take immediate action to protect yourself and those close to you.

Following a disaster, government agencies and other aid organizations may take several days to offer relief aid. Preparedness is the responsibility of every individual and family. In fact, being prepared individually, as a family, a neighborhood, or a community is the best strategy for surviving a disaster. Experience repeatedly proves that individuals and communities who prepare in advance have a greater chance of surviving and recovering from a disaster. In short, nothing replaces proper preparedness.
