EMERGENCY DISPATCHING CHANGE

If you have had to call 911 since November 1, you may have noticed a change in how the call was answered.

Prior to November 1, your call would have gone to the Kenton County Dispatch center; since November 1, your call will be directed to the Erlanger Dispatch Center. This is because the city has entered into an agreement with Erlanger for the provision of all emergency dispatching services, including for Fire, EMS and Advanced Life Support (ALS), and Police.

The decision to leave the Kenton County center in favor of Erlanger's was not a quick or easy one to make. Kenton County has provided the city with quality dispatching service for many years. However, Erlanger is doing things with technology that made their system much more attractive to us. Members of city administration, the fire department, and the police department examined Erlanger's system and operations for nearly a year before the final decision was made to switch. We are hopeful that the technological advances we will enjoy on the Erlanger system will allow our first responders to provide better service to our residents.

You, as a resident, should make note of the following. In an emergency, simply dial 911. The call will automatically be directed to the appropriate dispatch center. If you need assistance, but it is not an emergency, please call the 24-hour non-emergency number at 727-2424. If you have a monitored alarm system, please contact your monitoring company (ADT, Brinks, Etc.) to make them aware of the change. This will help prevent unnecessary delays that may result if the wrong center is notified.

We hope these changes are not an inconvenience to you, and we hope that the transition from one center to the other is a smooth one. We are confident that the change will ultimately allow us to provide better service to the community.

SNOW EMERGENCY by General Services Director Stan Goetz

The City has an ordinance that prohibits all motor vehicles from parking on any street in the City during a Snow Emergency. A Snow Emergency may be declared by the Mayor anytime driving condi-

tions are deemed hazardous. It is automatically in effect when there is a snowfall of two or more inches.



We notify radio and television stations of declared Snow Emergencies, but they do not always broadcast the notice. These notices are not required and you may receive a citation without prior notification. Also, your car may be towed if it creates a hazard on your street.

HOLIDAY TRASH SCHEDULE

There will be no trash or recycling collected on Tuesday, December 25th and Tuesday, January 1st. If you have a Tuesday/Friday pickup you will only have one pickup on Friday.

RECYCLING REMINDER

Just a reminder of what items may be placed in your red bin: Newspaper, Junk Mail, Plastics #1 and #2, Magazines, Catalogs, Box Board, White and Colored Paper, Computer Paper, Brown Paper Bags, Cardboard Boxes, Steel Food Cans, Aluminum Beverage Cans and Glass Bottles and Jars.
