

Kenton County recently passed an ordinance to collect an insurance premium tax on all non-incorporated residents. This tax does not affect Edgewood residents but we have been receiving calls that this tax has been added to some residents insurance policies, both homeowner and auto. After reviewing my own policy, I found it had been added to mine also. If this insurance premium tax has been added to your policies, please call your insurance agency to inform them that Edgewood does not collect this tax so they can make the adjustment, and deduct this amount. You do not owe this tax.

Due to the recent hot and dry weather, our major street repairs are in full swing and most of this year's repairs should be finished before the bad weather sets in. The sidewalks are now complete along Marie and Colony, not only for those who enjoy walking, but as a means for the children to walk to school.

Our own "Fireman Joe", Joe Stambush, has recently received recognition for his outstanding Fire and Life Safety Programs across Kentucky. The Kentucky Fire Fighters Association presented Joe with this award at their annual conference on July 28th. Congratulations Joe!

The Northern Kentucky Water District will be flushing hydrants the week of September 17th between the hours of 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.




