In 2015, the Dudley Hill project was completed and to date we have had no major traffic accidents. We hope this safer roadway section will continue to serve us all well in the years to come. Safe driving must be followed in all areas of the city but this section of roadway takes a little more concerted effort. Keep up the safe driving.

One of our other completed projects was the sidewalk connecting South Loop to St. Elizabeth hospital so runners and walkers can now walk around the entire St. Elizabeth campus.

Our latest completed project was the installation of the new traffic light at South Loop and Thomas More Parkway to ease the traffic from St. Elizabeth's at all hours of the day. We are working with the Highway Department and should have the light fully functional as soon as they program it for the traffic in the area.

The Lyndale and Edgewood roadway construction is moving along. The storm water portion is drawing to a close. The water line replacements will follow before installing the curbs and gutters and final paving. Our hope is to have the waterline phase of the project completed by June and start road construction in July. If this works we will shorten a proposed three (3) year project to an estimated one and a half $(1 \frac{1}{2})$ years.

With the mild weather this fall we were blessed to have many more homes decorated and made the selection of the winners of the Home Decorating contest more difficult. The list of the nine (9) winners is up on our website at www.edgewoodky.gov . Thanks to you all for lighting up your neighborhoods and bringing the spirit of joy to our hearts.

IUST A REMINDER-PET CONTROL

The City of Edgewood has laws regulating "domestic animals": 90.02 Animals Running At Large-No. person who is the owner of any animal shall permit it to run at large in any public road, highway, street, lane or alley, or upon unenclosed land, or permit it to go on any private yard, lot, or enclosure without the consent of the owner of the vard, lot or enclosure.

90.17 Restraint Required-All dog owners shall restrain any and all dogs on a leash or confine them within a fence or other enclosure, so that the dog is restricted and separated from adjoining neighbors and the general public.

90.16 License Required - No dog owner shall allow any dog to be present within the city unless such a dog is licensed according to the statures

of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and ordinances of Kenton

Pooper Scooper Law-Nobody shall cause, permit, allow, aid, assist, encourage or engage in the use of any real estate of another, public or private, for any defecation thereon, by any dog or cat, within the ownership, custody or control thereof. The owner and custodian of any dog or cat which defecates

upon any real estate of another, public, private, shall have the duty, obligation and responsibility of immediately removing such defecation there from, and causing the disposition thereof, according to law. Conviction of violation carries a fine of \$500 and/or imprisonment not to exceed 12 months.

Fireman Mike Says... by Firefighter Mike Constantino

I hope everyone had a great holiday. I've got a few safety tips for the winter season. Residential fires are more prevalent during the winter months and according to the U.S. Fire Administration (USFA), it's estimated over 100,000 winter residential building fires occur each year in the United States. Cooking and heating are by far, the leading causes of these fires. To ensure a fire safe winter season, it is important to be more attentive to the use of cooking materials and equipment, and make sure furnaces and chimneys are professionally cleaned and smoke alarms are properly maintained



Many residents are unaware of the potential threat that carbon monoxide (CO) poses in their homes. Called the "silent killer," carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless and tasteless gas that can be deadly. It is produced any time fuel is burned and may come from common household appliances, such as gas stoves, water heaters and fireplaces. Because carbon monoxide has no smell or taste and the initial poisoning symptoms often mimic the flu (headache and nausea), victims may be unaware they are being exposed. The only safe way to detect carbon monoxide in your home is with working carbon monoxide alarms. CO alarms are available at your local home improvement store and are easy to install. Be sure to place CO alarms on every level of your home and near sleeping areas to help keep your family safe. CO alarms should be replaced every 5 to 7 years. If you don't know how old your alarms are, you should replace them today!
