We hope everyone had a Happy Holiday Season. As we settle into the short, cold days of winter,

let's focus on our feathered friends. Here are a few helpful tips for keeping our avian friends healthy:

- 1. To keep up their high metabolic rate, most backyard birds eat rich, energy foods such as seeds, insects and suet. Suet is a great food to offer many of the birds that will visit backyards since it provides high calorie and high fat foods
- 2. Oil sunflower and peanuts are also great foods to offer birds in the wintertime.
- 3. Placing seed in a ground feeder entices birds such as sparrows, juncos, Mourning Doves, guail, pheasants, towhees and Brown Thrashers.
- 4. Feeders should be located out of the wind. Close to the house or a group of trees works well.
- 5. Birds do need a source for water in the winter. You can help your birds by providing an open

The City has an ordinance that prohibits all motor vehicles from parking on any street in the City during a Snow Emergency. A Snow Emergency may be declared by the Mayor anytime driving conditions are deemed hazardous. It is automatically in effect when there is a snowfall of two or more inches. We notify radio and television stations of declared Snow Emergencies, but they do not always broadcast the notice. These notices are not required and you may receive a citation without prior notification. Also, your car may be towed if it creates a hazard on your street. Snow Emergencies are put into effect for your safety as well as the City's. It allows the Public Works Department to plow and salt the thoroughfares without the additional hazard of parked vehicles. If it is snowing, or if snow is predicted, please remove your car(s) from the street. Let's all work together to keep our streets clear and safe for everyone. Happy

Although the popularity of carbon monoxide (CO) alarms has been growing in recent years, it cannot be assumed that everyone is familiar with the hazards of carbon monoxide poisoning in the home. Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels (such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane) burn incompletely In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel are potential sources of carbon monoxide The only safe way to detect carbon monoxide in your home is with working carbon monoxide alarms. CO alarms are available at your local home improvement store and are easy to install. Be sure to place CO alarms on every level of your home and near sleeping areas to help keep your family safe. CO alarms should be replaced every 5 to 7 years.
