Please Watch Out for Pedestrians in Crosswalks

With the summer months upon us the city is asking drivers to be extra vigilant of pedestrians, children, bikers, etc. in crosswalks. Please see the below ordinance in regards to pedestrian right of way: (KRS 189.570 (12), (13), (14))

(B) Driver to exercise due care. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions herein, every driver of a vehicle shall exercise due care to avoid colliding with any pedestrian upon any roadway, shall give warning by sounding the horn when necessary, and shall exercise proper precaution upon observing any child or any confused or incapacitated person upon a roadway. (KRS 189.570 (6) (d))

(C) Penalty. Whoever violates any provision of this section shall, upon conviction, be subject to a minimum fine of \$20.00 as set forth in KRS 189.990 (1), and a maximum fine as set forth in § 70.99.

Rumpke Trash & Recycling

Rumpke trash information – residents can have two 95-gallon containers or one 95-gallon container and up to three (3) additional bags per trash pickup. Yard waste - if it doesn't fit in the trash container then it must be bundled in three-foot sections in order for Rumpke to take it. If residents have larger items to dispose of such as furniture, residents must call Rumpke in advance at (877) RUMPKE7 to arrange pick up. Mattresses and upholstered furniture must be wrapped in plastic before setting out to the curb.

Summit Fire **Apparatus History**



Edgewood, Kentucky is home to many unique individuals and businesses. There is one unique business whose owner has always called Edgewood home. Joe Messmer, he is the President of Summit

Fire Apparatus. He runs the business with his brother Tom Messmer, Vice President, Treasurer. Their father, Charles Messmer, started the company, Summit Welding and Fabricating in the 1950's. He had a 1956 Ford F-250, a lot of determination and some God given talent. He installed a welding machine on his truck, some compartments for tools, traveled from job to job and ran the business from his home. The business grew and moved to Madison Pike, and then it its current location on Sperti Drive, Edgewood. In 1994 the facility was expanded, bringing the total square footage to 31,000. It is surprising that a facility large enough to build, paint and restore fire trucks exists right here in Edgewood.

Summit Fire Apparatus still does a lot of welding and fabricating business. They made the butterflies at the shelter in front of R. C. Hinsdale, weld lawn chairs for Edgewood residents, made wheel chair racks for the hospital as well as the star over the hospital at Christmas time, fixed snow plows, and provided the metal covering construction areas on our streets. Summit has loyal employees who think in 3-D and can build almost anything.

Charles Messmer built his first piece of fire equipment, a tanker truck, in 1958. Summit Fire Apparatus found its niche, building unique fire trucks. They











complete complex projects that larger fire truck manufacturers will not touch: a refinery in Toledo has an industrial pumper they call The Dragonslayer, the tri-state area (Kentucky, Ohio and Indiana) share a Chemical Biological. Radiological, Nuclear and Explosives (CBRNE) response vehicle, and Kenton County has Air I, an air and light vehicle that is housed in Edgewood's firehouse; all engineered and produced by Summit. Air I was a FEMA project brought to Summit by the Kenton County Fire Chiefs' Association.

You may see Air I in the annual 4th of July parade. You may also notice a 1956 International, Old 1. Summit was instrumental in refurbishing Edgewood's very first pumper truck. Some firefighters saw her for sale in a used truck magazine. They purchased the truck for \$2,500 and began restoring it with funding from fish fry's.

Summit Fire Apparatus is proud to be the 2018 Grand Marshal of the 4th of July Parade. Please join us for all the 4th of July festivities and meet some other people who choose to call Edgewood their home.

Edge of the Woods Garden Club News

Sustainability. The word sustainability is being used a lot recently. What does it mean? One definition states it is "the avoidance of the depletion of natural resources in order to maintain an ecological balance." So how can we, as gardeners, help sustain this beautiful planet earth?



One way is to install rain barrels in our yards. According to the EPA, "A rain barrel is a system that collects and stores rainwater from your roof that would otherwise be lost to runoff and diverted to storm drains and streams". Catching and using rainwater can be as simple as a single plastic barrel with a gravity feed to a flower bed, or they can be sophisticated systems that supply all your water needs. The benefits include reducing demand on existing water supply, and reducing run-off, erosion, and contamination of surface water. Rainwater is good for plants because it is free of salts and other minerals that harm root growth. Plants like rainwater because it's naturally soft, and free of chlorine and other chemicals. Use it to water your lawns, potted plants, garden beds and even your indoor plants.

The "Edge of the Woods" Garden Club is always open to new members. Our goal is to help beautify our city by planting and maintaining seasonal displays of flowers in pots throughout the city. Fireman Mike Says...

Summer is the time to enjoy vacations, camping, picnics and Independence Day; however, summertime also brings fires and burn injuries due to fireworks and outdoor cooking. Fireworks start an average of 18,500 fires per year. These



fires caused an average of 3 deaths, 40 civilian injuries, and an average of \$43 million in property damage. In 2015, U.S. hospital emergency rooms treated an estimated 11,900 people for fireworks related injuries; 51% of those injuries were to the extremities and 41% were to the head. Children younger than 15 years of age accounted for 26% of the estimated 2015 injuries.

The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend public fireworks displays, leave the lighting to the professionals. The City of Edgewood provides this excitement on the holiday annually.

Enjoy outdoor celebrations and cookouts but remember to keep a 3 foot "safe zone" around grills and campfires. Only use your grill outside and keep it away from siding and deck rails. Open your gas grills before lighting and keep an eye on your grill without leaving them unattended.

Knowing a few fire safety tips will help everyone have a safe summer. Stay safe, stay hydrated and we can't wait to see you at the July 4th parade.
