During an October council meeting, our city engineer, John Wiley, reported on the Dudley Road project. Mr. Wiley stated the project is fifty-one (51) to sixty (60) percent complete with six (6) to eight (8) weeks until the estimated completion date. The unfortunate news was the contractor is currently behind our estimated time table. The project has had multiple set-backs including delays for such things as gas and sewer lines crossing under the roadway that were not known to exist but were discovered during excavation, a water line that upon installation had a manufacturing flaw and several gas and water breaks due to out dated lines.

Those issues are now behind us and Mr. Wiley say's our new goal is to have the road open by the end of November with a minimum acceptance of the several layers of blacktop suitable for safe passage way. He truly believes worst case would be the second week in December barring the weather holds out. It is the city's standpoint we must have the roadway opened for traffic before the inclement weather hits our door step. We will continue to move forward and keep everyone informed of the changes.

On October 26th, the city hosted our annual Spooky Sunday event with Beetle Juice, costume parade, costume contest, treat bags, haunted forest and magic show. The success of this event was witnessed by over 450 adults and children celebrating the fall event. The weather was beautiful and after a walk in the haunted forest, they were treated to a magic show. I want to give special thanks again to all who volunteered and worked behind the scenes.

With darkness creeping upon us we are reminding our runners and walkers while out to be sure to face the traffic in areas that do not have sidewalks on either side of the street. Reflective tape or flashing lights should be worn to increase safety and visibility for both runners and walkers. Safety first is a must!

Santa and Mrs. Claus will be making their rounds at the Senior Center on Sunday, November 30, 2014. They are planning to arrive around 5:45 pm to light the Christmas tree and stay for pictures. Do not forget to bring your cameras to take pictures that will last a lifetime.

SNOW EMERGENCY by BOB BEGNOCHE, General Services Director

The City has an ordinance that prohibits all motor vehicles from parking on any street in the City during a Snow Emergency. A Snow Emergency may be declared by the Mayor anytime driving conditions are deemed hazardous. It is automatically in effect when there is

a snowfall of two or more inches.

We notify radio and television stations of declared Snow Emergencies, but they do not always broadcast the notice. These notices are not required and you may receive a citation without prior notification. Also, your car may be towed if it creates a hazard on your street.

Snow Emergencies are put into effect for your safety as well as the City's. It allows the Public Works Department to plow and salt the

thoroughfares without the additional hazard of parked vehicles. If it is snowing, or if snow is predicted, please remove your car(s) from the street. Let's all work together to keep our streets clear and safe for everyone. Happy Holidays!

PROPERTY TAX DUE DATE CHANGE FOR 2015 In October 2015, when you receive your tax bill you will see a change in the discount and the due date. The new discount amount will be 2% if paid by November 30th or the full amount will be due December 31st (new date) starting in 2015. This notice shall give everyone one year to prepare for the change. There will be no change to the 2014 bill that has already been mailed.

First and foremost, I would like to thank the citizens of Edgewood for attending our Open House on October 5th. It was a little cold and windy, but that didn't stop the hundreds of guests we had this year. It was very successful and as always it was great to see all of the kids so that we can continue to educate them on Fire Safety. And in case you forgot to test your smoke detectors when the time changed, please do so as soon as possible. They really do save lives!

One of my favorite times of the year is Thanksgiving and Christmas. Holidays are always special, but with them come the hazards of the season. Did you know that heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths? With a few simple safety tips and precautions you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

- Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a 3 foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Test smoke detectors monthly.
- Another common fire hazard occurs in the kitchen. Never leave food unattended that is cooking on the stove.
- Inspect holiday lights for frayed wires, bare spots, or excessive wear before putting them up. Use only lighting listed by an approved testing laboratory.
- Do not link more than 3 light strands, unless the directions indicate it is safe.
- And last but not least, never go near a Christmas tree with and open flame candles, lighters or matches.
