Come join us for a fossil hunt led by the experts from the Behringer-Crawford Museum, Saturday, September 24th, 10 a.m., at the city building. People from all over the world come to this area to dig for what you may have in your own yard. After an introduction to fossils and how to search for them at the city building, we will travel to a local site to dig up fossils for your own collection. You provide transportation to the site. Wear comfortable clothes and sturdy shoes and bring a zip lock storage bag for your finds. The dig is limited to the first 100 Edgewood residents who pre-register. FREE EYE SCREENINGS

Halpin-Noll Eye Center, a division of Tri-State Centers for Sight, has provided general ophthalmology care to Tri-State residents for the past 30 years. Their office is offering a Free Vision Screening at the Edgewood Senior Center on Thursday, September 1, 2016 from 10:00 a.m.-1 p.m. There will be a sign-in sheet and they will see people on a first come first serve basis. Trained ophthalmic technicians will provide visual acuities for distance and near, and intraocular pressure (glaucoma screening). They will also provide education on eye care including cataracts, glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy, and macular degeneration. The screening will take about 10 minutes and will **NOT** require having your eyes dilated. If you wear eyeglasses please bring them to the screening so we can test your best corrected vision. COUNCILMAN BARLAGE'S EDGEWOOD HISTORY NOTES

Did you know that in August 1862 Confederate General John H. Morgan brought a band of his raiders up Madison Pike north to the base of Dudley Road. Local "Home Guard Militia" led by Maurice Beach fired on them from a home approximately where the old Chevy dealership is. The exchange of fire was not enough to warrant Morgan's full retreat and his band staved in Sanfordtown but later took a road west (likely Dudley) towards the Lexington Turnpike (Dixie Highway) to continue his aggressions on Union troops. If you have any historical items related to our community. photographs, slides, 8mm movies or other paraphernalia depicting years gone by, we would be very interested in producing a copy for our archive. EDGEWOOD FIRE/EMS "OPEN HOUSE"

Children will have the opportunity to learn fire safety with Hands-On activities such as a "Stop, Drop and Roll" Station and the "Have 2 Ways Out" Station. We'll have a house with simulated flames and the kids will be able to use an actual fire hose connected to one of our fire trucks to knock down the flames. We will have a 911 simulator and a demonstration on how to extinguish a fire involving pots/pans on your stove for the adults. There will be fire helmets, coloring books and many other goodies for the kids. There will be Inflatables for kids to play on! Of course the kids will be able to see and touch a fire truck which is always a favorite. We will have baked goods and refreshments compliments of our Rehab Team. Don't miss out on a great time!

Hope everyone enjoyed their summer. Fall weather is just around the corner. And of course fall means October which is Fire Prevention Month. This year's theme is "Don't Wait - Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years!" This is the third year in a row that smoke alarms have been the focus. It's that important! We've learned that we need a smoke alarm in every bedroom and on every floor and that the batteries need to be checked on a regular basis. The final focus is for you to check the manufacturer's date on the back of your alarm. If your smoke alarm is over 10 years old, it needs to be replaced.



During the month of October, the Edgewood Fire Department will be doing programs to enhance these prevention efforts. One of the events will be our Annual Open House on Sunday, October 2nd from 11am - 2pm at the fire station. We will have lots of things for the kids to do including inflatables for the kids! So please save the date and join in on the fun activities planned. Also during the month of October we will have Fire Station Tours, School Visits to the classrooms, and visits to Day Cares. We are going to tell each child during the school visits that they have a homework assignment for their parents. The assignment is to make their parents test their home smoke alarms and check the age of the smoke alarms. So parents should be ready to assist them. Plan now to help us continue to keep Edgewood a safe place to live.

Lastly, fall is the season when the fire department responds to 911 calls regarding camp fires. As a reminder, Open Burning is prohibited within the Edgewood City Limits. Only fires less than 3 square feet in area for ceremonial or cooking purposes are permitted.



Rumpke trash information - residents can have two 95 gallon containers or one 95 gallon container and up to three (3) additional bags per trash pickup. Yard waste - if it doesn't fit in the trash container then it must be bundled in three foot sections in order for Rumpke to take it. If residents have larger items to dispose of such as furniture, residents must call Rumpke in advance at 859-472-7339 to arrange pick up. Mattresses and upholstered furniture must

be wrapped in plastic before setting out to the curb.
