Did you know that what we call Edgewood was originally 3 separate cities? The city of Edgewood which was bounded by Dixie highway and Turkeyfoot Road, Pius Heights which included 114 acres and 106 houses in the area of St. Pius X Church and Summit Hills Heights in the vicinity of Brookwood Drive and beyond. It wasn't until the late 1960s that a merger between the three was realized to become what we know as Edgewood today. If you have any historical items related to our community, photographs, slides, 8mm movies or other paraphernalia depicting years gone by, we would be very interested in producing a copy for our archive. #### **Fireman Mike Says...** by Firefighter Mike Constantino

Let me start by reminding you that Daylight Savings Time begins on Sunday, March 13th at 2 a.m. While you are changing your clocks one hour ahead, be sure to change the battery in your smoke detectors too! Also check the date on the smoke detector to see if it has expired. Most smoke detectors and CO detectors are good for 10 years, so replace if needed. As part of spring cleaning make sure to take a few minutes to

clean up and brush off your safety plans as well:



- Make sure you have smoke alarms inside every bedroom, outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home, including the basement.
- Clean-up work areas. Put dangerous tools, adhesives, matches or other work items away and out of any child's reach.
- Check fire protection and safety equipment to include fire extinguishers.
   Make sure all doors and windows open easily and are accessible for quick escapes.
- Make sure your street numbers are posted properly and are visible. If you
  were to call 911, you want us to respond as quickly as possible. If we can't
  see your address numbers on the mailbox or house, it could cause a delay.
- Practice your escape plan. Even the best plan is no good if it's not practiced.
