Snow **Emergency**

by General Services

The City has an ordinance that prohibits all motor vehicles from parking on any street in the City during a Snow Emergency. A Snow Emergency may be declared by the Mayor anytime driving conditions are deemed hazardous. It is automatically in effect when there is a snowfall of two or more inches.

We notify radio and television stations of declared Snow Emergencies, but they do not always broadcast the notice. These notices are not required and you may receive a citation without prior notification. Also, your car may be towed if it creates a hazard on your street.

Snow Emergencies are put into effect for your safety as well as the City's. It allows the Public Works Department to plow and salt the thoroughfares without the additional hazard of parked vehicles. If it is snowing, or if snow is predicted, please remove your car(s) from the street. Let's all work together to keep our streets clear and safe for everyone. Happy Holidays!

...... **Garden Club News**

With the rapid change from hot to cold weather in October, it was guite difficult to get out into the garden to do some of the winter preparations, but its still not too late for perennial care and garden cleanup! Some perennials like Penstemon, Shasta daisies and hardy Geraniums have a basal crown of leaves (lowest leaves on the plant) that stay green over the winter. If you have not done so, the stems and upper leaves on these plants should be cut back as they will die back with the frost, but leave the basal crown of the leaves. For some other perennials you may want to wait until spring to cut back because they provide winter interest or food for birds. Leave seed heads of black-eyed usans (Rudbeckia), coneflowers (Echinacea), Laitris and Joe Pye weed (Eupatorium). Sedum and ornamental grasses provide good winter visual interests if left uncut in the fall.

It is also time to begin cleaning fall leaves out of your perennial beds. If left to mat down thickly on your perennials they may foster conditions that cause root rot. It is a good idea to shred them up before you compost them. An easy way to shred fallen leaves is to mow them with your lawn mower. Blow or rake the leaves close to the compost pile and run your lawn mower through them with the discharge shoot directed toward the pile. You may also use the shredded leaves directly as mulch to your garden. If rain is insufficient you should continue to water your perennials shrubs and trees until the first hard frost. And don't forget to get spring bulbs in the ground as soon as possible to welcome warmer weather and get that spring gardening itch started! Happy Gardening!

Did you know that there was once a Baptist Church and Cemetery on Dudley Road? In the open field along Dudley road just south of Amelia Drive. Situated on ground that sheds water to the Dry Creek (Anderson Ferry) area. From this waterway the church took its name "Dry Creek Baptist Church". This church and meeting house served the early Pioneers of Edgewood. The reverend Thomas Dudley gave many spirited sermons at this location. Baptisms often took place in the nearby pond (likely an early version of the Foltz pond). In 1856 a new church was built at the corner of Dixie Highway and Buttermilk pike. That church has undergone many alterations and is now part of the large handsome white painted home just north of the current intersection. In the 20th century a water tower resided on the Dudley Pike parcel and now it is once again an open field whose overall dimensions vary little from that early 1800s church yard. Since water is the underlying theme of this entry, be sure to catch the major motion picture "Dark Waters" this fall when Anne Hathaway portrays Edgewood native (my sister) Sarah Barlage and Mark Ruffalo portrays her husband Robert Bilott in his career long David vs. Goliath battle against DuPont for carcinogen free drinking water. Their story can also be found in book form at Joseph Beth entitled "Exposure".

hazards of the season. Heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths With a few simple safety tips and precautions, you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

- Keep anything that can burn at least 3feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a 3 foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a gualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- TEST SMOKE DETECTORS MONTHLY!
- Inspect holiday lights for frayed wires, bare spots or excessive wear before putting them up. Use only lighting listed by an approved testing laboratory.
- Do not link more than 3 light strands, unless the directions indicate it is safe.
- And last but not least, never go near a Christmas tree with and open flame – candles, lighters or matches.
