## CITY OF EDGEWOOD COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES April 17, 2017 6:30 PM

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u> – Mayor Link called the meeting of the Edgewood City Council to order at 6:30 PM in the council chambers of the Edgewood City Building. The following council members were present: Nancy Atkinson, Ben Barlage, Joe Messmer, Jeff Schreiver and Rob Thelen. Also in attendance were City Administrator Brian Dehner, Senior Deputy Clerk Belinda Nitschke and City Attorney Frank Wichmann. Council members Dale Henson and Tony Ward were absent.

### INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

APPROVAL OF AGENDA - no changes

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> – April 3, 2017 Council Meeting Minutes – Mrs. Atkinson made a motion to adopt the April 3, 2017 minutes as written; second by Mr. Thelen. Mr. Barlage and Mr. Schreiver abstained. Motion passed: 3 ayes – 2 abstentions.

<u>REPORT/PRESENTATIONS</u> – Senator Chris McDaniel gave a quick legislative update, he recommended residents visit <u>www.lrc.ky.gov</u> for more information on current legislation.

Ben Brandstetter – Brandstetter Carroll, Inc – gave an update on the Dudley Road project. The water department has already started water main work. Utility poles that need to be relocated have been identified and sent to Duke Energy. Bidding for Phase I and II should happen in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of this year. Phase I and II are from Winding Trails to Catherine Drive, Phase III and IV are Catherine Drive to just before the Turkeyfoot intersection and then just after Turkeyfoot to Dixie Highway. Ben also gave a brief update of Brookwood Road, this project has been divided into three sections known as: North, Central and South.

Mayors Report – The kickoff video for the # DUFFLESHUFFLE will air on May 4<sup>th</sup> – the #DUFFLESHUFFLE is a challenge to get residents and businesses involved in the community by donating new duffle bags (with or without items inside) to the children at the Children's Home of Northern Kentucky. These bags can be dropped off at the city building through June 30<sup>th</sup>. Mark your calendars, on August 19<sup>th</sup> there will be a Neighborhood Launch for Heroin meeting at the Senior Center.
