

Bill Mullins and Dan Kauffung from Valsasis (The Door Store) came to a City Council meeting explaining the services they offer for the weekly shopping newspaper ads. A resident can call to stop receiving these ads or call to receive these ads by contacting 513-731-1200, 859-594-3600 or emailing cmdetton@valassis.com. If you wish to stop delivery, it usually takes one week or less to take effect. If you wish to stop services while on vacations or extended trips to avoid driveways filling up with ads, you are able to do so by calling the number listed above.

By now, you have seen the new solar speed monitors on our main streets and side streets. These unites are tools capable of recording the time of day, the number of trips, and the speed in which the auto is traveling on any given day. We are able to move these units from street to street, so we can give current statistics. This helps us to confirm what speeding concerns we have that way we can patrol the area at those given times of curtail speed abuse. Please keep an eye on your speed!

Just a reminder, that no city is immune from persons who are willing to break into your auto or home for a quick item that be taken and sold for quick cash. # Edgewood History

#### Captain George Reed Dudley

(1811-1890) was a steamboat owner and manufacturer. He married Emma S. Lofland in Louisville, KY in 1845 and had 5 children. The family spent their summers on their farm (present day Belle Meade) on Latonia Road (present day Dudley Road). Captain Dudley was a director of the Junction Turnpike committee which oversaw the tolls and maintenance of Dudley Hill. This is likely how the road eventually gained the name Dudley. The youngest of Captain Dudley's Children was Dr. William Lofland Dudley 1859-1914. Dr. Dudley was an accomplished Chemistry professor at Vanderbilt University.

Listed are a few of his achievements:

- 1880 Developed the first reported method of refining iridium.
- 1887 President Grover Cleveland appointed Dudley to a special commission regarding the weight and fineness of coins.
- · 1889 Appointed vice president of The American Association of the Advancement of Science.

- · 1895 Appointed Vanderbilt's first Medical Department dean.
- · 1897 Director of Affairs of the Tennessee Centennial and International Exposition.
- · President of the Vanderbilt Athletic Association for 25 years.

Known as the "father of Vanderbilt football" the University honored Dr. Dudley by naming the Football Field "Dudley Field" in his honor. To this day the playing surface is still known as "Dudley Field". Dr. Dudley and Captain Dudley are merely some of the famous Dudley clan. Their forefather Thomas Dudley 1576-1653 was a founder of the Massachusetts Bay Colony, Cambridge Mass, and signed Harvard College's charter in 1650!

#### Fireman Mike Says... by Firefighter Mike Constantino

Hopefully everyone remembered to change the batteries or replace your old smoke detectors back in March when moving the clocks forward. If not, it isn't too late, so do it now!

I'd like to touch base on "Planning an Escape" from your home in case of a fire:

• MAKE a home escape plan. Draw a map showing

the doors/windows and discuss with family members.

 KNOW at least 2 ways out of every room, if possible. Practice using different ways out.



- PRACTICE your home fire drill at night and during the day at least twice a year.
- TEACH children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- · CLOSE doors behind you as you leave. This is very important to slow down fire spread.

#### IF THE ALARM SOUNDS...

- If the smoke alarm sounds, GET OUT AND STAY OUT. Never go back inside for people, pets or anything. Only firefighters go into a house with smoke/fire
- If you have to escape through smoke, GET LOW and GO under the smoke to your way out.
- CALL 911 (Fire Department) from outside your
