Just a reminder, this falls tax bills will reflect a two percent (2%) savings if paid by November 29, 2019. After that date, no discount will be offered and full payment will be due on December 31, 2019.

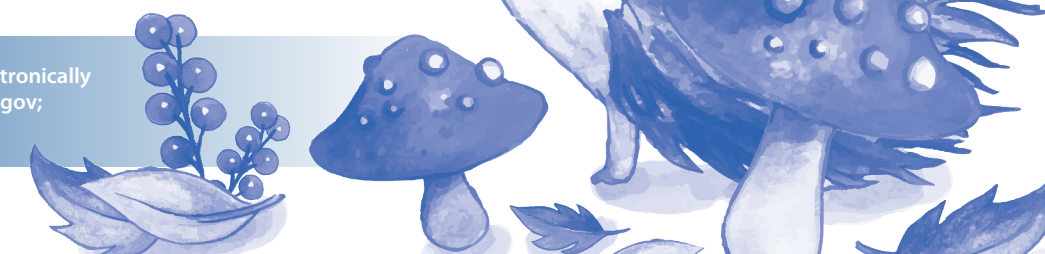

## Fireman Mike Says... by Firefighter Mike Constantino

Hope everyone enjoyed their summer. Fall weather is just around the corner. And of course, fall means October which is Fire Prevention Week, but we like to celebrate and teach for the entire month of October. This year's theme is "Not every hero wears a cape. Plan



and Practice your Escape!" With this year's theme, we're going to inspire and empower everyone in the community, grown-ups and children alike, to be heroes in their homes, schools, and workplaces by planning their escape from a home fire or by planning their emergency evacuation. Whether it's testing the smoke alarms once a month or mapping out escape routes in the home, there are all sorts of ways for individuals to be heroes at home. During the month of October, the Edgewood Fire Department will be doing programs to enhance these prevention efforts. One of the events will be our Annual Open House on Sunday, October 6th from 11 – 2 at the Edgewood Fire Station. We will have lots of things for the kids to do including inflatables for the kids! So please save the date and join in on the fun activities planned. Also, during the month of October, we will have Fire Station Tours, School Visits to the classrooms, and visits to Day Cares.

Lastly, fall is the season when the fire department responds to 911 calls regarding camp fires. As a reminder, open burning is prohibited within the city limits of Edgewood. Permissible fires are those fires that include candles, torches, grills, and ceremonial fires that are burned in an area no greater than three (3) square feet. These fires must also be in an enclosed metal container or surrounded by noncombustible materials, such as stone. These fires should not be left unattended and is recommended that a hose connected to a water source or other appropriately sized extinguisher be present. During extreme weather conditions, this regulation may be superseded by a higher governmental authority.

## COUNCILMAN BARLAGE'S Edgewood History

Earlier this summer Councilman Messmer shared with the City a land survey of his property on Dudley Road that was scribed in 1859 and 1874. This parcel of property is located across from Prestwicke subdivision. Interestingly, the 1874 survey depicts a small school house on a parcel now occupied by the vacant Fifth Third Bank branch. I have found other references to this old school house such as the following from the Enquirer in April 1923: "Roy Halpin and Edward Albers were charged with having made beer in an old log schoolhouse on the Dudley pike and were fined \$50 ea." Likely not in operation for many years, might the structure have been abandoned? A little bootlegging taking place here by the sounds of it.

Hopefully, I will find out more.

Due to an error, the last History note was missing some content. The crux of the story was that the Fredrick Remington Bronze sculpture in the Oval office was donated to the President in 1973 by the Hatfield sisters of Edgewood.
