

Fireman Mike Says...

Let me start by reminding you that Daylight Savings Time begins on Sunday, March 8th at

2 a.m. While you are changing your clocks one hour ahead, be sure to change the battery in your smoke detectors too! Also check the date on the smoke detector to see if it has expired. Most smoke detectors and CO detectors are good for 10 years.

Furthermore, as part of spring cleaning make sure to take a few minutes to clean up and brush up on your safety plans as well:

- Make sure you have smoke alarms inside every bedroom, outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home, including the basement. If you have natural gas in your home, be sure to have working CO detectors as well.
- Clean-up work areas. Put dangerous

"Farm for sale: 38 acres of land on the Dudley Pike, two miles from Erlanger, KY., near the Dixie Highway. 3 Miles from Covington; 300 apple trees, 300 peach and 300 pear trees; It is estimated there will be 2,000 bushels of apples this year; good house and good barn; good fencing; a money-maker and convenient to Covington." (CINCINNATI ENQUIRER, AUG. 4TH 1918)

I am uncertain of the exact location of this post. 38 Acres matches a parcel back on Hurstborne Lane.

"Mr. and Mrs. Harry B. Mackoy, Mr. and Mrs. Collins Lee, Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Gale and Mr. and Mrs. Harry Hartke chaperoned the young people at a merry barn dance Wednesday evening, given for the Kenton County Red Cross Chapter, in the handsome new barn recently erected by Mr. Hartke on his farm near Ft. Mitchell, on Dudley Pike."
