

Now is the time to re-seed or fertilize your lawns, replace landscaping shrubs or trees that have become tired or unsightly and even plant some perennials. Next, choose flowers you like based upon where you will plant them - sun, shade, or partial sun & shade as well as moisture requirements. Now, Edgewood's 8,700+ residents can use SeeClickFix to report quality-of-life issues directly from their mobile phones to the City. The app, called "Edgewood Engage", gives residents the ability report, vote on, comment on, and follow issues that matter to them the

most. In addition, SeeClickFix provides the City of Edgewood the tools to respond to these issues efficiently and effectively. This is a web tool allows citizens to report non-emergency neighborhood issues, which are communicated to local government. You have the option to upload a photo with each service request, as a visual reference to help communicate the issue. Customer service requests are routed to city staff to help answer your questions and provide solutions. The City of Edgewood staff responds to Edgewood Engage requests during regular business hours. If this report comes in on a holiday, weekend or after-hours, it will be read on the next business day. Please be advised: Edgewood Engage is NOT to be used for emergencies. For urgent matters, that require immediate attention or a police response, call 9-1-1.

Fireman Paul Says...

As we all know, Daylight Savings Time began on Sunday, March 8th. This was a great time to change the batteries in your smoke and CO detectors! Additionally, be sure to check the

expiration dates on your detectors as well. Most smoke and CO detectors are good for 10 years—so if they are older than 10 years, please replace them.

Furthermore, as part of your spring-cleaning, make sure to take a few minutes to clean up and brush up on your safety plans as well:

- Be sure to have a smoke alarm inside every bedroom in the house, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home. This includes the basement. If you have natural gas in your home, make sure you have working CO detectors with fresh batteries as well
- Clean-up work areas. Secure dangerous tools, adhesives, matches, and other work

- items away and out of reach from any children.
- Check fire protection and safety equipment including all fire extinguishers. Make sure all doors and windows open freely and are easily accessible for quick escapes if necessary.
- Make sure your street numbers are posted properly and are visible. The mailbox is an excellent location and helps responders accurately find your address quickly. Clear identification of an address helps with the quickest emergency response possible and helps lead to better outcomes. Inability to correctly identify an address could lead to a delay in potentially life-saving care.
- Practice your escape plan! Even the best plan is no good if it's not practiced regularly.
 Everyone in the household should be aware of the escape plan and have practiced it.
