





The holiday shopping season is quickly approaching and the Edgewood Police Department wishes everyone a safe shopping experience. We would like to recommend some quick and easy steps to take during the season to help keep it an enjoyable one. It is very important to always remember to lock your vehicles when you park them on the street or in your driveway overnight. Make it a habit to push that remote button and hear it lock or physically check to ensure that your vehicle is secure overnight. Remember that out of sight is often out of mind. Keep your valuables with you. Please don't leave high value items in your vehicles overnight. While you are shopping consider taking a blanket with you. It will not only be helpful during the colder fall/winter days, but when you are shopping at multiple locations, place that blanket over the items you have already purchased. Your communication with the police department is vital to the success in fighting those who wish to cause harm. When you see something, please say something. We can easily be reached 24 hours a day, 7 days a week through the Kenton County Emergency Communications Center (dispatch) at 859-356-3191 or 911 for an emergency. With your eyes and your call, we can respond during the incident to have the opportunity to deal with the issue during the time of the incident. Thank you for calling and letting us know how we can

Fireman Paul Says... by Firefighter

One of my favorite times of the year is

Thanksgiving and Christmas. Holidays are always special, but with them come the hazards of the season. Heating equipment is one of the leading causes of home fire deaths. With a few simple safety tips and precautions, you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.

Have a 3 foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.

Never use your oven to heat your home.

Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.

Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.

TEST SMOKE DETECTORS MONTHLY!

Inspect holiday lights for frayed wires, bare spots or excessive wear before putting them up. Use only lighting listed by an approved testing laboratory.

Do not link more than 3 light strands, unless the directions indicate it is safe.

And last but not least, never go near a Christmas tree with and open flame candles, lighters or matches.

The holidays are also a time whereby we may be spending more time in the kitchen preparing tasty food for our loved ones and friends.

Often when we are called to a cookingrelated fire, the residents tell us they only left the kitchen for a few minutes. Sadly, that is all it takes for a dangerous fire to start. The bottom line is that there is really no safe period of time for the cook to step away from a hot stove. A few key points to remember:

Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, grilling, or broiling food. If you must leave the room even for a short period of time, turn off the stove.

When you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, stay in the home, and use a timer to remind you.

Keep cooking areas clean and clear of combustibles (e.g. potholders, towels, rags, drapes and food packaging).

Keep children away from cooking areas by enforcing a "kid-free zone" of three feet around the stove.

If you have a fire in your microwave, turn it off immediately and keep the door closed. Never open the door until the fire is completely out. If in doubt, get out of the home and call the fire department

Always keep an oven mitt and a lid nearby. If a small grease fire starts in a pan, smother the flames by carefully sliding the lid over the pan (make sure you are wearing the oven mitt). Turn off the burner. Do not move the pan. To keep the fire from restarting, do not remove the lid until it is completely cool. Never pour water on a grease fire. If the fire does not go out, get out of the home and call the fire department.

If an oven fire starts, turn off the heat and keep the door closed. If the fire does not go out, get out of the home and call the fire department.

A cooking fire can quickly turn deadly. There have been too many homes destroyed, and people killed or injured by fires that could have been easily avoided. Please heed these simple safety rules. We firefighters would like to be in your kitchen, but only when you invite us for

Snow Emergency by General Services

The City has an ordinance that prohibits all motor vehicles from parking on any street in the City during a Snow Emergency. A Snow Emergency may be declared by the Mayor anytime driving conditions are

deemed hazardous. It is automatically in effect when there is a snowfall of two or more inches.

We notify radio and television stations of declared Snow Emergencies, but they do not always broadcast the notice. These notices are not required and you may receive a citation without prior notification. Also, your car may be towed if it creates a hazard on your street.

Snow Emergencies are put into effect for your safety as well as the City's. It allows the Public Works Department to plow and salt the thoroughfares without the additional hazard of parked vehicles. If it is snowing, or if snow is predicted, please remove your car(s) from the street. Let's all work together to keep our streets clear and safe for everyone. Happy Holidays!
