No registration is required.

COUNCILMAN BARLAGE'S Edgewood History

In 1955 Edward Landwehr moved his family to a house in the 3200 block of Turkeyfoot Road in what is now Edgewood Kentucky. He purchased several acres of land with a large house that had many bedrooms and a detached garage. A pond near the road and wooded areas is what he needed for his growing family. Edward ran the Landwehr's Hardware & Paint store in Covington, Ky in the 800 block of Madison Avenue. It is still operated today by one of his children. Edward was very active in the 'new St. Pius X Parish' that was being built in the mid 1950's on Dudley Road. He & his family sponsored and ran a large booth at the church festival in July of each year to support the church and school. Back in the 1950's Turkeyfoot Road ended just a short distance from where Dudley Road intersects it due to a farmer's field. The western portion could be accessed by Dudley Road, the eastern portion from Dixie Highway. Edward's home was bought by the Kenton County School System in the early 2000's and the Caywood Elementary school was built on that area.

Many Landwehr relatives have moved into Edgewood since the 1960's onward and remain active in the city.

Edge of the Woods Garden Club News

While the weather is not yet appealing for being out in the garden in the early spring months, there are still a lot of things you can do to prepare for the outdoor gardening season ahead. Just as important as preparing the soil or planting seedlings, so is proper care of your gardening pots and tools. Empty, clean and sanitize all pots with the same solution used to clean tools (see below). Now is the perfect time to get out those trimmers, spades, pruners and lawn mower blades to clean, sanitize, sharpen and protect them. RUST: If you find you have rust on the blades, soak the item in white vinegar for 24 hours, remove, wipe and blot dry. Then use any type kitchen scrubber to clean thoroughly making sure you get

into all the cervices to completely rid the tool of rust. SANITIZE: Soak the cutting edge of the tool in a solution of either 10% bleach/90% water or 10% Lysol or other disinfectant/90% water for one hour. Wipe the tools and blot dry. This removed bacteria, fungi and helps prevent disease that can impact both your existing and new plants. SHARPENING: If the tool has a beveled edge, mark it with a Sharpie pen to ensure you have sharpened the entire edge, taking care to hit any burrs or high spots with the whetstone. Another option is using an angle grinder with a 110-120 grit flap disc; this may require clamping the tool to a workbench or alternatively, using zip-ties to hold it in place while you sharpen. Be sure to wear eye protection or a face shield when sharpening tools. PROTECT: The final step is treating the tools with 3-in-1 oil and rubbing it in thoroughly with a soft cloth to protect your tools from rust and extend the life of the tool. Investing in good quality tools will save you money in the long run and they can last for years with the proper care. Happy Gardening!

As we all know, Daylight Savings Time will begin on Sunday, March 14th. This is a great time to change batteries in your smoke and CO detectors! Additionally, be sure to check the expiration dates on your smoke and CO detectors as well. Most smoke detectors and CO detectors are good for 10 years—so if they are older than 10 years, please replace them.

Furthermore, as part of your spring, cleaning make sure to take a few minutes to clean up and brush up on your safety plans as well:

Be sure to have a smoke alarm inside every bedroom in the house, outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home. This includes the basement. If you have natural gas in your home, make sure you have working CO detectors with fresh batteries as well.

Clean-up work areas. Secure dangerous tools, adhesives, matches, and other work items away and out of reach from any children.

Check fire protection and safety equipment including all fire extinguishers. Make sure all doors and windows open easily and are easily accessible for quick escapes if necessarv.

Make sure your street numbers are posted properly and are visible. The mailbox is an excellent location and helps responders accurately find your address guickly. Clear identification of an address helps with the guickest emergency response possible and helps lead to better outcomes. Inability to correctly identify an address could lead to a delay in potentially life-saving care.

Practice your escape plan! Even the best plan is no good if it's not practiced regularly. Everyone in the household should be aware of the escape plan and have practiced it.
