Keeping an eye open within the neighborhood and call 911 if you see something out of place or suspicious. Keep your doors and cars locked at all times.

Edge of the Woods Garden Club

Are your plants hungry? In container gardening, the most important step after cleaning your pots is preparation of the SOIL. If you are using the soil in your containers from last year, after removing all roots, clumps and old vegetation, you can enhance the soil using one of the following methods.

Method 1: replace half of the soil in your container with new potting soil and mix well.

Method 2: remove 1/3 of the soil from your container and replace it with a good quality compost and mix thoroughly.

With either method, be sure to add in a high quality slow-release fertilizer such as Osmocote or Dr. Earth and moisten the soil lightly to activate the bio-organisms in the soil.

The health of your soil plays a big role in the health of your plants, just as your health is impacted by the foods you eat. Soil should contain both organic (and inorganic materials (i.e., silt, sand & clay) to help keep your soil moist, but allow good drainage. In addition to the soil methods above, adding trace minerals to the soil with products such as Kelp Meal

or Azomite will re-mineralize depleted soil and provide healthier plants throughout the season. Once your soil is ready, you can plant your favorite flowers or vegetables, then lightly mulch the top of the soil with a biodegradable mulch like rice hull to help maintain moisture. Remember to feed your plants weekly with a water-soluble fertilizer and enjoy.

Fireman Paul Says

Hopefully everyone remembered to change the batteries or replace your old smoke detectors back in March when moving the clocks forward. If not, it isn't too late, so do it now! + ECGEWOOD + FIRE

I'd like to touch base on "Planning an Escape" from your home in case of a fire:

- MAKE a home escape plan. Draw a map showing the doors/ windows and discuss with family members.
- KNOW at least 2 ways out of every room, if possible. Practice using different ways out.
- HAVE an outside meeting place (tree, light pole, mailbox, neighbor's house) a safe distance from the home and preferably in the front yard.
- PRACTICE your home fire drill at night and during the day at least twice a year.
- TEACH children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- CLOSE doors behind you as you leave. This is very important to slow down fire spread.

IF THE ALARM SOUNDS...

- If the smoke alarm sounds, GET OUT AND STAY OUT. Never go back inside for people, pets or anything. Only firefighters go into a house with smoke/fire.
- If you have to escape through smoke, GET LOW and GO under the smoke to your way out.
- CALL 911 (Fire Department) from outside your home.

Edgewood History

AN EDGEWOOD GEM AND ITS HERITAGE...

In 1948, the same year that Edgewood was incorporated by the state assembly, two young couples pooled their resources and purchased 6.6 acres of farmland in the middle of Edgewood. Bert & Mary Shelton and Bert's sister Nancy Martin and her husband George divided the property and sold two lots fronting Dudley Road. An easement allowed them access to the interior acreage on which they each built their homes. The secluded property on which the two couples raised their families was surrounded by trees and a lovely creek that still runs across the front of the property.

Bert's passion was growing a vegetable garden, consisting of staples such as corn, green beans and tomatoes, broccoli, horseradish and peanuts. Brother-in-law, George, maintained an apple orchard.

As Edgewood grew around this secluded little gem of property, the next generation put down their roots. However, in 2008 the two properties that had passed to the second generation were combined upon the untimely passing of the Martin's daughter, Janie Cochran. The Shelton's daughter, Mary, and her husband Tony Luebbers, cared for the properties and took pride in cultivating new plants such as raspberry patches, Wisteria, Peonies, Easter lilies, Hydrangea, and Yucca plants. Elephant ear, Naked Lady and Canna gifts from friends and family also adorned the property. Many of these "heritage plants" were passed along through several generation of the family.

When Tony Luebbers passed away in 2014, his wife Mary wanted to maintain the property but found it difficult for one person to manage. Although there were multiple parties interested in purchasing the property, Mary Luebbers and her two grown children considered their options and agreed that making their property a part of Presidents Park, which had been built adjacent to their property, would be the best way to preserve its heritage and character. Mary approached Edgewood city officials about acquiring the property and they responded enthusiastically to the possibility of expanding the park.

The City of Edgewood purchased the Luebbers' property and invested in it to create the White House Event Center, Mary and Tony's former home. In addition, the city created a walking trail in the woods near the tennis courts and has plans for a gazebo in a picturesque setting.

Mary joined the Edge of the Woods Garden Club and has played an important role in creating and implementing a new "Heritage Garden" on the property as well as caring for the property flowers and landscaping. The garden, distinguished by the stone "E" is located along the sidewalk leading from the parking lot to the pergola-covered deck of the White House Event Center. Many plants belonging to the family have been rescued and replanted there for all who visit the property to enjoy. Those of us in the garden club have watched the beautiful transformation of the property which fulfills the wishes of the family to provide an area that can be enjoyed by all residents of the city and visitors. We have this gift as a result of a generous family that wished to share with others their "little piece of heaven."²
