#### **Edgewood Engage**

Now, Edgewood's 8,700+ residents can use SeeClickFix to report quality-of-life issues directly from their mobile phones to the City. The app, called "Edgewood Engage", gives residents the ability report, vote on, comment on, and follow issues that matter to them the most. In addition, SeeClickFix provides the City of Edgewood the tools to respond to these issues efficiently and effectively. This is a web tool allows citizens to report nonemergency neighborhood issues, which are communicated to local government. You have the option to upload a photo with each service request, as a visual reference to help communicate the issue. Customer service requests are routed to city staff to help answer your questions and provide solutions. The City of Edgewood staff responds to Edgewood Engage requests during regular business hours. If this report comes in on a holiday. weekend or after-hours, it will be read on the next business day. Please be advised: Edgewood Engage is NOT to be used for emergencies. For urgent matters, that require immediate attention or a police response, call 9-1-1.

## **Edge of the Woods**

Do plants have Companions? Much like people, plants have companions. Positive companion plants can assist in growth of others by attracting beneficial insects, repelling pests, or providing nutrients, shade, or support to other plants; they can actually be a part of a biological pest control. Some plants however, should not be planted together as they can have negative impacts on surrounding plants; think kryptonite. This phenomenon is referred to as positive or negative "allelopathy." Allelopathy comes from the Greek words allele (one another or mutual) and pathy (suffering). It refers to a plant releasing chemicals that have some type of effect on another plant. Here are some positive examples:

#### Nasturtium + Cucumber

When growing cucumbers up a trellis, plant nasturtiums at the base of them. These pretty flowers have a unique scent that seems to repel pests, and the flower of the nasturtium is edible!

#### Melons or Squash + Flowering Herbs Flowering herbs such as dill, fennel, and parsley attract the pollinators required to produce these vegetables.

While these are just a few examples of positive allelopathic plants; a quick search on the web can produce a plethora of both positive and negative allelopathic combinations. Be sure to check these out when planning your next garden project.

ever to be careful while driving. Children often don't double check cross walks before crossing the street, so drivers must be aware of the pedestrians when passing through cross walk areas. Another area of concern is simply driving down streets. Please be mindful of the speed limits. The general speed limits on most streets in Edgewood is 25 mph. This is normally ok, but a child can dash out after a ball or just run between cars and they are in front of a vehicle faster than a driver can stop. We would like our children to be safe and enjoy their summer and it is just as important for parents and guardians to train their children about safety when it comes to vehicles. Sweet Alyssum seeds can easily be planted between rows of vegetables, attracts hover flies, insects that control aphids that attack many herbs such as chives, cilantro, dill, oregano, as well as Swiss Chard.

Calendula + Broccoli The sticky substance produced on the stems of Calendula attract aphids and trap them there! Planting them next to broccoli and other brassica plants keeps the aphids off the broccoli and attracts beneficial ladybugs that eat aphids.

#### **Tomatoes + Basil** or Cilantro

The strong scent of basil and cilantro repels pests and bring in pollinators. Just add mozzarella cheese and balsamic reduction and you have an amazing appetizer!

#### Fireman Grant Says...

Summer is the time to enjoy vacations, camping, picnics and Independence Day; however, summertime also brings fires and burn injuries due to fireworks and outdoor cooking. Annually almost 10,000 Americans are injured by fireworks and almost 5,000 are injured by charcoal/wood-burning and propane grill fires. When GRILLING, keep a 3 foot "safe zone". Only use your grill outside and keep it away from siding and deck rails. Open your gas grills before lighting and keep an eye on your grill without leaving them unattended.
