

You will receive a 2% discount if paid by November 30th. Final payment is due by December 31st, if not paid by this time the bill becomes delinquent on January 1st, 2022.



Halloween 1914, as interpreted from the Cincinnati Commercial Tribune.

One of the many Halloween parties was given by Miss Groche Kircher at her home on Dudley Hill. (SE corner of Dudley and Winding Trails). Those present were Misses Lucy Gibson (lived on a farm, now Sanctuary Ct.), Cornelia Bilz (lived on a farm, now Woodrun Ct.), Leona and Rose Schwartz (lived on a farm, now Belle Meade), Frances

Geiger, Kate Reigler (lived on a farm, now the Entrance to Whispering Woods), Helen and Edith Cahill (lived on a farm, now Prestwicke), Ivy and Emily Fessler (lived on a farm, now Meadowlark), Pauline Hostman, Marie Byson, Louise and Edith Sanders (lived on a Turkeyfoot farm, South of Woodlyn Hills), Clara and Margaret Reeves, Grace and Elva Kircher (lived on a farm, now the Entrance to Winding Trails). Messrs. John Gibson (lived on a farm, now Sanctuary Ct.), John and Robert Cahill (lived on a farm, now Prestwicke), Joe and George Reigler (lived on a farm, now the Entrance to Whispering Woods), George and Robert Fessler (lived on a farm, now Meadowlark), John and Albert List (lived on a farm, now the Entrance to Thomas More), Fred Requardt (lived on a farm, now Walker Estates), John Reeves, George Guth, Ralph Dyer, C. Vicky, Joseph Cahill and Leonard Rul.

Researching a few of the attendees it appears to have been a Halloween Party for the youth of the area. People in their teens and 20's getting together for what I would imagine to be a barn dance.

Despite the continued warm temperatures, the Garden Club Members worked diligently to change out the summer flowers and create the wonderful autumn displays by the first of October. As you've walked/run or traveled through Edgewood along Dudley Road, many of you have expressed your appreciation to the gardeners for their work; on behalf of all of us, thank you! Your kind words are so very much appreciated.

The Butterfly Garden, located next to the White House Event Center, is coming along nicely. The city's Park employees did a great job clearing the designated area and building the stone garden wall. The timing allowed garden club members an opportunity this autumn to plant butterfly and pollinator plants which will root-in over the winter. An existing Paw Paw tree was incorporated into the Butterfly Garden to bring interest and beneficial insects. In the spring, more pollinator and butterfly plants will be added to complete the garden. The goal is to meet all criteria for registration by mid-summer for a Monarch Butterfly Waystation. The Monarch migration

through Northern Kentucky happens between August & October as they make their way to Mexico to winter.

Don't Fall Victim to Scammers

Chances are you have received a phone call, an email, or even a text message from a scammer trying to obtain your personal information. Often times these scammers can appear legitimate. They may have the PayPal logo in their email, or sound very professional with a base level knowledge of your personal information. They can also be very convincing when they tell you that your financial account has been compromised, or that the IRS is investigating you for some sort of federal tax code violation. Usually, they will then follow this up with a request for personal information. **Don't share your personal identifying information with anyone who contacts you unsolicited, Never send money via gift card, green dot card, or wire transfer to someone you have never met face to face. Avoid clicking on links or opening attachments in unsolicited emails, or messages. Don't complete questionnaires on social media asking for background information. What should you do if you are already a victim of a scammer? Immediately contact your bank and notify them of the fraud. Contact your local police department and file a police report. Contact the credit bureaus and consider putting a freeze on your credit.**

These types of scams tend to disproportionately affect the elderly. So, if you have an elderly person in your life that may be vulnerable, please have a conversation with them and discuss the information above.

Snow Emergency by General Services

The city has an ordinance that prohibits all motor vehicles from parking on any street in the city during a Snow Emergency. A Snow Emergency may be declared by the mayor anytime driving conditions are deemed

hazardous. It is automatically in effect when there is a snowfall of two or more inches.

We notify radio and television stations of declared Snow Emergencies, but they do not always broadcast the notice. These notices are not required and you may receive a citation without prior notification. Also, your car may be towed if it creates a hazard on your street.

Snow Emergencies are put into effect for your safety as well as the City's. It allows the Public Works Department to plow and salt the thoroughfares without the additional hazard of parked vehicles. If it is snowing, or if snow is predicted, please remove your car(s) from the street. Let's all work together to keep our streets clear and safe for everyone. Happy Holidays!
