

#### Fireman Tony Says...

Let me start by reminding you that Daylight Savings Time begins on Sunday, March 13th at 2 a.m. While you are changing your clocks one hour ahead, be sure to change the battery in your smoke detectors too! Also check the date on the smoke detector to see if it has expired. Most smoke detectors and CO detectors are good for 10 years.

Furthermore, as part of spring cleaning make sure to take a few minutes to clean up and brush up on your safety plans as well:

- Make sure you have smoke alarms inside every bedroom, outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home, including the basement. If you have natural gas in your home, be sure to have working CO detectors as well.
- Clean-up work areas. Put dangerous tools, adhesives, matches or other work items away and out of any child's reach.
- Check fire protection and safety equipment to include fire extinguishers.
   Make sure all doors and windows open easily and are accessible for quick escapes.
- Make sure your street numbers are posted properly and are visible, preferably on your mailbox. If you were to call 911, you want us to respond as quickly as possible. If we can't see your address numbers on the mailbox or house from the street, it could cause a delay.
- Practice your escape plan. Even the best plan is no good if it's not practiced.



#### Edge of the Woods Garden Club News

**Do you push the envelope?** For those of us who are anxious to get out into the garden and start planting, or find ourselves sad to tear out the garden when the sunlight hours wane and the temperatures begin to dip - there is the **Cold Frame**.



The soil temperature required for seed germination is ~70°F and it takes several warm, sunny days in a row to attain this. When flowers & seeds begin showing up at the garden store we are (sometimes too) anxious to get out into the garden which can result in a low success rate and high frustration. In our area, the week **after** Mother's Day is typically safe for planting. This is where the cold frame comes in.

What is it? Cold frames are bottomless boxes that are set over plants or seeds in the garden in a sunny location to protect them from adverse weather and retain heat. They can be any variety of heights and have a transparent top that can be flat or raised to hold and amplify the sun's heat. The higher the angle of the lid slope, up to 55 degrees, the more sunlight will enter the frame during winter. A hinge on the top of the frame provides easy access and allows 'venting' during the warmer hours of the day. They can be used in the spring to jumpstart seedlings or to "harden off" plants that have been started indoors, and they can extend the autumn garden well into late fall. Planting seeds for salad greens, kale, spinach & snow peas (my favorite) every two weeks provides a steady supply of cool weather crops and with a little care can even be maintained throughout the winter! Once the weather is warmer, the cover can be removed and the cold frame used as a raised garden. So, we have learned to 'hedge' with Mother Nature...now are you feeling spunky?

**How do I get started?** For the DIY'er, a cold frame can be built out of lumber and glass, plexiglass or plastic sheeting (materials < \$50). Kits are also available (Amazon, ~\$100). Is This a Scam?

It really is hard sometime to know if the person on the other end of the line is someone who is trying to scam you. What do I do? How can I know? What should I do if I feel like I have made a mistake? First of all, it is important to know that it is not your fault and unfortunately, you are not alone. Many people fall victim to scams every year. Scammers do not care if you are a victim of a natural disaster or if you are older or younger. They simply are trying to get to your money. Many of us know of someone who has been scammed! The Federal Trade Commission is available to help inform people about fraud activity and scams. Please take some time to review their

website, www.ftc.gov. Many scammers are starting to use social media and email spoofing. Email spoofing means that it will look like it is from a friend or trusted source, but they mask their true email addresses. Don't be afraid to verify the source or ask a friend or we would love to help as well! Phone scams are still very prevalent. If someone says they are from the police or sheriff's office, please be careful. There are times we do call, but we will never ask for money to be sent to us, especially in the form of gift cards. Gift cards should be your first clue that something is not right. Don't be afraid to hang up on them as well. If you are ever in doubt, trust your instincts and verify before you commit! Edgewood History

If you worked for the US Post Office or the Department of Commerce in the late 1920s you may have had the opportunity to get a bird's eye view of what is now Edgewood, KY. How you may ask? You may have been part of the team building the Louisville / Cincinnati Airway Beacon #7 (D) located at 424 Dudley Road directly across the street from the current Whispering Woods entry park. The Beacon consisted of a tower, four-legged, 75 feet in height and painted orange and white. There were small red lamps on the rail of the tower that would flash morse code "dah dit dit" denoting the letter D. The main beacon rotated and had a 24" parabolic mirror and a 110V 1 Kilowatt lamp spinning at 6 rpm, creating a quick one-tenth second flash every ten seconds. In clear weather it could be seen for 40 miles! The tower sat on a concrete slab in the shape of an arrow that pointed towards Lunken Airfield. An adjacent 10x14 generator shed was required to keep the device in action. The roof of the shed was painted with "LC" on the west and "7" on the east. This beacon was one of 1500 erected across the nation to assist pilots with navigation prior to modern day radar. I am not exactly certain when it was dismantled, but I suspect it was a welcome deletion from the Dudley landscape. Vincent Kahmann once told me that he could see the light from his childhood bedroom near modern day Lindsey Drive. I am always looking for more stories like this to investigate, so if you have a suggestion, please reach out.
