# Edge of the Woods Garden Club News .....

Fun Garden Facts [and a touch of Chemistry]

**K** [Potassium] To promote flowering and increase the size of your blossoms, cut up a banana peel and soak it in water for 2-3 days; dilute this banana solution by adding water to a 1:5 ratio (example: 1 oz. banana water to 5 oz.

Hairy roots? When planting "hairy" stemmed plants such as tomatoes, place the plant as deeply in the soil as possible to cover all the hairs - these are actually roots! You can remove the lower leaves on the plant to increase the planting depth. The plants grow stronger and sturdier to provide the best yield.

Please, no tears! To improve rooting, make a paste of chopped onion and aloe vera gel by adding both to a blender; dip plant cuttings into the solution for a few minutes before planting in the soil to help them root faster and guaranteed rooting. (Stinky hands? To remove the onion

smell from your hands, rub hands on something stainless steel like the kitchen faucet; it removes the smell immediately!)

Gentle please...When transplanting seedings, use a spoon to lift up the small seedling, holding it gently by the leaves rather than the root; transplant it into a larger pot or into the outdoor garden, being careful not to squeeze the tender plant stem.

**Ca [Calcium]** When boiling eggs, rather than discarding the water, use it to water your plants that require a lot of calcium, such as tomatoes and peppers. Calcium can also be extracted from egg shells by dissolving them in vinegar. First, make eggshell powder by placing dry eggshells in a blender, then add about a cup of white vinegar and stir. Let stand for one hour. Dilute with water and use to water your plants. Just like people, plants need calcium for strength too!

Mg [Magnesium] Epsom Salts are not just for soaking our aching muscles in a hot bath; plants love it too! It is the magnesium in Epsom salts that helps to ease our aches, but also aids in plant seed germination, chlorophyll production and absorption of vital nutrients like nitrogen and phosphorus.

Hint: sometimes muscle cramps are caused by low magnesium. Add dark leafy greens. avocado, and nuts to your diet as these are rich in magnesium. By the way, spinach can be started by seed outdoors in a cold frame as early as February in our region. Why not start your crop

### Fireman Mark Says...

As we welcome the warmer weather, I hope you and your family have inspected your smoke AND Carbon Monoxide (CO) detectors to ensure they are in proper working order and not expired-most smoke detectors and CO detectors are good for 10 years.

As we enjoy this warmer weather be sure to remember to monitor the possibility for severe weather. As we have seen last year severe weather can strike any time of year and anywhere in our region. Here are some tips to keep you safe in the event of severe weather:

- Have a weather radio or a weather alert app on your smart phone (make sure it's charged!)
- Have a tornado emergency plan including a 'safe shelter', your safe shelter should be the in the basement or an inside room without windows on the lowest floor (bathroom, closet, center hallway). Do not stay in a mobile home.
- Have an emergency kit with a supply of water and non-perishable food located in your safe shelter area
- Know the difference between a tornado warning and a tornado watch:
- Tornado Warning: means a tornado has been sighted and may be approaching. Seek shelter immediately!
- Tornado Watch: means there is a possibility of one or more tornadoes in your area. Continue normal activity but monitor weather conditions closely.
- Listen for the storm sirens, the storm sirens are tested the first Wednesday of every month at noon.
- Kenton County's Storm Warning Sirens are activated when:
- A Tornado Warning is issued for Kenton County by the National Weather Service (siren will be activated again if a credible report of a funnel cloud is witnessed)
- A credible report of a funnel cloud or tornado
- The sirens may be activated for other emergencies, such as a hazardous materials leak
- Please be sure to have multiple ways to receive warnings and not solely rely on the sirens
- o In the event of hearing the storm siren tune in to local media for

In 1875 D.J. Kenny authored his book "Kenny's Illustrated Cincinnati". The epitome of nineteenth century guidebooks, it includes descriptions of Cincinnati and the surrounding suburbs. Drive No. 8 (by carriage) mentions our Dudley Road and its vistas. "If you wish to extend the drive (south), you may continue along the pike (3L) half a mile to the village of Sanfordtown, and turn to the right, up the hill, by the Dudley Road, at the first corner. From the hill, a valley view of unexpected beauty is presented. Follow the road in its general trend to the right, and at a distance of about two miles from the hill-top strike the Lexington Turnpike (Dixie Highway)." In this short but sweet account we hear of the beautiful vistas across the landscape. During this winter season it is easy to imagine the vistas he is describing. So next time you drive up Dudley hill and start rounding the bend past Prestwicke, look to your right and you can see the City Building and St. Pius Church across the valley. Imagine that entire valley being somewhat void of trees and hosting a variety of farmed homesteads. You too will see the "Unexpected Beauty" described by D.J. Kenny so many generations ago. ### There is No Off Season for Scamming!



Spring is often a time of renewal. Plants begin to sprout and bloom, people start to come outside more often, kids are playing and enjoying the fresh smells and warmth of spring. It's an exciting time of year for everyone! The officers who patrol the streets enjoy the opportunity to see our residents out and about during their shift patrols.

Those coming out are not limited to those with good

intentions, but also those who do not. I would like to take an opportunity to remind you to take a moment when confronted by something that seems too good to be true or if a disastrous phone call is received stating that you have a warrant or someone you know is in jail and needs help. I have to remind you that

many of these calls are from individuals with the intent on scamming you out of your money. In cases like the IRS calls, the IRS will NEVER call you asking for money. In cases where you "have a warrant", the police will never call you to ask you to pay the fine over the phone. Gift cards are NEVER the appropriate form of payment to any legitimate bill.

Please stop, and contact the Edgewood Police Department for help in these situations, before you ever try to make any form of payment. Do not give your social security number or any other personal information over the phone to someone you do not know.
