FIREMAN MARK SAYS...

Hopefully everyone remembered to change the batteries or replace your old smoke detectors back in March when moving the clocks forward. If not, it isn't too late, so do it now!

I'd like to touch base on "Planning an Escape" from your home in case of a fire:

- MAKE a home escape plan. Draw a map showing the doors/windows and discuss with family members.
- KNOW at least 2 ways out of every room, if possible. Practice using different ways out.
- HAVE an outside meeting place (tree, light pole, mailbox, neighbors house) a safe distance from the home and preferably in the front yard.
- PRACTICE your home fire drill at night and during the day at least twice a year.
- TEACH children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- CLOSE doors behind you as you leave. This is very important to slow down fire spread.

IF THE ALARM SOUNDS...

- If the smoke alarm sounds, GET OUT AND STAY OUT. Never go back inside for people, pets or anything. Only firefighters go into a house with smoke/fire.
- If you have to escape through smoke, GET LOW and GO under the smoke to your way out.
- CALL 911 (Fire Department) from outside your home.

Edge of the Woods Garden Club Got the 'itch' to garden but space is a problem? Try Grow Bags!

Grow bags offer a good alternative for those who have limited space for growing a garden. They are available in various sizes and materials, so it is important to first decide what you want to grow and how much sun and space you have. Many grow bags come with handles and are made of polypropylene or burlap; this makes them a great choice as they are light and can easily be moved to different areas of the garden, deck or patio for the sun or shade requirements of the plants.

The porosity of these grow bag means that roots are 'air pruned' rather than growing in circles as can occur with plastic or ceramic containers. Those bags with side flaps allow you to monitor the soil for pests as well as watch the progress of your root plants such as potatoes, carrots, or turnips. Because grow bags are porous, they will require more frequent watering, and in the heat of the summer could need water daily. To evaluate for moisture, gently lift the corner of the bag and if it is light, water it; if it is heavy, you can skip watering that day.

When choosing a location, consider that sunloving plants such as tomatoes, peppers, and melons need about six hours of sun per day. As for size, a general rule of thumb is a 3-gallon grow bag will accommodate 1 pepper (or similar) plant or salad greens; a 5-gallon bag is large enough for one tomato plant (plus cage), and a 10-gallon bag is best for root vegetables or up to three vegetable plants. Use a good potting or container soil and fill the bag about 2/3 full; plant your vegetables and add a time-released fertilizer, such as Osmocote™ to the top of the soil.

At the end of the growing season, empty, clean and fold the dry grow bags for easy storage and they should last for two to three seasons. The utilitarian appearance of grow bags may make them less attractive for flowers unless cascading or spreading flowers are used to make the bags less noticeable. There are so many flowers and vegetables from which to choose – enjoy experimenting with plants or seeds and learn as you grow!

Edgewood History COUNCILMAN BARLAGE'S NOTES:

Rooting through an estate sale last fall I came across a book entitled "The Comprehensive Plan of Covington, Kentucky and its Environs". This publication from 1930 described all the regional infrastructure improvements that could be made to strengthen the city. Some of these suggestions involved areas that now are part of Edgewood. Several maps show Dudley Road being expanded in length westward, all the way to River Road and east all the way to Decoursey Pike! This newly expanded Dudley Pike would double to four lanes and become one of several ring roads around Covington. From an air travel standpoint, this comprehensive plan of 1930 describes how the current day President's Park property north-west towards Turkeyfoot Road with its 900-foot elevation would be the ideal location for a major regional airport. A small air strip was already in service there at that time, so the proposal likely seemed justified to those involved. Reading through these ideas and more, I start to wonder what our city would have looked like if these revisions had come to pass. Or would we even have a city at all?

Chief's Corner

Prescription Drug Disposal

As many of you are already aware, the Edgewood Police Department has a drug takeback deposit box in our lobby. You can drop off any unused prescriptions in this box and it will be disposed of. Our officers collect the drugs, empty them from the bottles and then package them to be incinerated. We are happy to provide this necessary service for our residents.

There are a few items that would assist our officers during the preparation process. Please do not drop your empty prescription bottles in the Prescription Box, this is not necessary, you can simply throw those bottles in the trash. If you wish to put all your medications into one Ziplock bag, this is fine, but please make sure it is sealed. Unpackaged prescriptions in the box makes it more difficult and potentially dangerous to us as we empty the box and prepare them for incineration.

Here are a few things that you cannot

drop in the collection box. Please do not drop liquids of any kind in the box. We do not have a procedure to handle liquids, this includes eye drops, cough medicine and similar items. Also, if you have any type of sharps, including needles of any kind, EpiPens or anything of the like, please do not put those in the box. We have a sharps container on the side of the box for these items. Also, there is no need for you to drop off over the counter medication. This can simply be thrown away in the trash.

Thank you for helping us help you in removing old prescriptions from your residence. This helps eliminate the possibility of a young person accidentally gaining access to medications that could be very dangerous to them. As always, if we can be of any assistance to you, please don't hesitate to call us, our dispatch number is 859-356-3191, simply ask for an Edgewood officer or you could call our office number 859-331-5911, but we may not be in the office at the time of your call. If it is an emergency, please don't hesitate to dial 911.
