Start Your Own Vegetable Garden – **Even for First Timers!**

Growing your own vegetables doesn't have to be difficult, just begin with a few veggies you enjoy. If space is limited, container gardening is an option; you can also share seeds with a friend if you have too many. This is a wonderful project to share with your children or grandchildren and can become a life skill.

First, choose a location for your garden based upon what you want to grow and group together those with similar soil, moisture and sunlight requirements. The seed packets often provide this information or it can be obtained easily with a web search.

Here are some veggies that are easy to grow from seed:

Cool-weather crops can be planted as soon as the soil is workable in the early spring, Lettuce, Kale, Swiss Chard and Spinach can be planted directly into the soil and covered

with a plant cover to protect the plants from freezing. The plant covers come in different weights and can be removed during warm hours of the day and put back on at night until after the last frost of the season. Another great early crop is Sugar Snap Peas. While these require some type of trellis (or garden stakes with string), it is one of my personal favorites and they can produce into early summer. All of these cool-weather veggies can be planted again at the end of the summer after the days cool down.

Next, try Carrots and Radishes (these can be harvested in as early as 24 days!) which are 'Companion plants' and are best planted together. Note - carrots require more sandy soil so don't hesitate to work in some sand before planting the seeds - this will help keep your carrots straight and less deformed looking (a common first-time gardening mistake).

Green beans require warmer, moist soil but are fun to grow because they germinate so

quickly and you see the fruits (or veggies) of your labor quite quickly! There are a variety of beans (pole, bush, snap, etc.) from which to choose and the space you have may dictate which you can grow.

Cucumbers and Summer Squash (i.e., hook neck, zucchini) require quite a bit more room but just a couple of plants can supply you with veggies nearly all summer. Cucumber requires high Nitrogen so select your fertilizer accordingly (first letter on the fertilizer, NPK = nitrogen phosphorus, potassium). Green beans "fix" Nitrogen so they get theirs from the atmosphere. Whatever you choose to grow from seed, enjoy the experience and have fun experimenting ... It just might remind you of your days as a kid, going out to play in the dirt.;)

Councilman Barlage's Edgewood History Notes:

On December 8th 1896 Ms. Emma L. Scott wrote a 6-column story for the Kentucky Post about the families living "Out along the Independence Pike" (Modern 3L Highway) and the Bank Lick Creek. Her narrative is a captivating report of the time period spanning from 1800 to 1896. In the article I spotted a curious description of the A.C. Ellis property on Dudley Road directly across from the present-day Ashely Greene Subdivision: "A.C. Ellis, the Covington attorney, considerable interest centered some four years ago, it being whispered about that the place was haunted. The cottage is situated on the summit of Dudley Hill, 250 feet above the turnpike, and to it the lawyer and his family yearly migrate in the summer. A few rods to the rear of the house the hill descends abruptly and far below is the path of an old country road. Winding its serpentine way among the hills. The sound of a vehicle passing on this road is heard and lost and heard again and lost. Owing to this fact and others of similar nature it was said that strange sounds were heard at night – that carriages were driven close to the house and suddenly disappeared; footsteps were heard on the threshold, which left no impress there; a child seemed to fall from some height, screaming as it fell. In time, however, these supernatural things proved themselves natural happenings, and the weird rumors ceased, much to the satisfaction of the family. Miss Eudora Sanford, the artist stepdaughter of Mr. Ellis spends much of her time there. To the left of the grounds a curious Indian mound is capped by a little summer house, overrun in summer with vines and creepers, which forms a retreat for the fair artist." I find myself wondering, was there really an Indian mound on this Edgewood Property? I am always looking for more stories like this to investigate, so if you have a suggestion, please reach out. Thanks!
