Councilman Barlage's Edgewood History Notes:

Next time you head down to Edgewood McDonalds and hang a right on Sperti Drive, look beyond the buildings and notice the broad view you have across Route 17 and the Banklick Creek. Well, in the 1950s local developer Frank Busch felt the same way and named this street "Broadview Drive". For a brief period in the 1960s, local inventor and research scientist Dr. George Sperti operated several buildings where New Perceptions and the storage facilities are currently located, and the street name was changed to Sperti Drive. Who is Dr. Sperti you might ask? Bridget Striker from the Boone County Planning Commission recently presented to the Behringer-Crawford Museum's NKY History Hour this very information. Quite remarkable to say the least. Dr. George Sperti was Born in 1900 to Italian Immigrants in Covington. When only 21 years of age he Invented a kilo-volt ampere meter and sold the patent to Westinghouse. (Similar to the electrical meters we see spinning so fast this time of year). From 1925-35 he managed UC's first science research lab and served as its director.

In this lab he developed ultraviolet technology commonly used today. He founded the Sperti Lamp Company to produce lamps for the irradiation of milk. His lamps introduced vitamin D to the milk without changing its flavor. General Foods invested in this patent and Dr. Sperti could now double down on his research. From 1935-1953 he



on the ideals of St. Thomas Aquinas. In 1936 Pope Pius XI appointed him to the "Pontifical Academy of Sciences".

operated "Institutum

During the war years he invented "Sperti Bio-Dyne Ointment" which was initially developed to treat military burn victims but is now known as "Preparation H". Dr. Sperti devoted much of his career to cancer research. He co-founded the American Society on Aging, discovered probiotic DAVAHIS and how it could treat staph infections, developed Procytoxin or PCO led treatments during chemotherapy.

During his lifetime he held over 120 patents! Dr. Sperti retired at the age of 87 stating that "Finding a cure for cancer has been my life". He passed in 1991 and is buried in St. Mary's Cemetery in Ft. Mitchell.

TMU and Mt. St. Joseph were both gifted scholarship endowments in his name. A remarkable genius who has left a mark on the world and our city!

Fireman Mark Says... Summer is the time to enjoy vacations, camping, picnics, and Independence Day; however, summertime also brings fires and burn injuries due to fireworks and outdoor cooking. Fireworks start an average of 18,500 fires per year. These fires caused an average of 3 deaths, 40 civilian injuries, and an average of \$43 million in property damage. In 2015, U.S. hospital emergency rooms treated an estimated 11,900 people for fireworks related injuries; 51% of those injuries were to the extremities and 41% were to the head. Children younger than 15 years of age accounted for 26% of the estimated 2015 injuries. The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend public fireworks displays and leave the lighting to the professionals.

Enjoy outdoor celebrations and cookouts but remember to keep a 3 foot "safe zone" around grills and campfires. Only use your grill outside and keep it away from siding and deck rails. Open your gas grills before lighting and keep an eye on your grill without leaving them unattended.

Knowing a few fire safety tips will help everyone have a safe summer. Stay safe, stay hydrated and have an amazing summer!

According to Edgewood City Ordinance 92.04 (O) the "Emission of noise or sounds which is noxious enough to destroy the enjoyment of dwellings or other uses of property in the vicinity by interfering with the ordinary comforts of human existence," would constitute a violation of our city's Nuisance Ordinance. This is often where the police are asked to step in. Please do your best to ensure that your music is loud enough for you to enjoy, but that your neighbors do not have to if they wish.
