Edge of the Woods Garden Club News

Ever wonder, what is the difference between a bulb and a tuber? In simple terms, both are underground plant parts that store nutrients and energy for the plant, although their structures and propagation are different.

**Bulbs** have an outer layer that protects the inside layers that are actually modified leaves; think of an onion, garlic, daffodils or tulips, which are examples of bulbs. These inside layers are where the plant stores food during the dormant cycle.

**Bulbs** have a rounded shape with a flat base, called a "basal plate", from which new 'daughter' bulbs develop. Bulbs grow new scales from the inside each year, which gives rise to a perennial growth cycle, Leaves and flower stems arow from the top of the bulb before emerging above soil level.

# **"What has EYES** but cannot SEE?"



On the other hand, tubers look more like thick roots and are actually swollen underground stems that store energy and nutrients for the

plant. Unlike bulbs, which produce similar, but not exact copies of themselves, tubers produce genetic copies of themselves through sprouting nodes, called "eyes."

Tubers are usually irregular in shape and look like thickened roots which do not have a basal plate. Rather, little buds, or "eyes" grow all over their surface and push up through the soil as shoots and stems, or down into the soil as roots. Examples of tubers are Dahlia, Caladium, and the most popular...the potato, which has a high nutrient content as is often grown as food. The next time you are eying those mashed potatoes, you just might decide to grow some!

So now you 'see' the answer... a tuber.
