Edge of the Woods Garden Club News



Starting flower seeds indoors can be a rewarding and fruitful endeavor, especially for gardeners in USDA Hardiness Zone 6. This zone encompasses regions such as ours where winters can be guite cold, but the growing season is long and conducive to a variety of flowers. By starting seeds indoors, you can get a jumpstart on the growing season and ensure your garden is bursting with vibrant blooms when the warm weather arrives. Here is a guide to help you navigate the process, including timing,

a few herb suggestions to complement vour floral display.

Timing: When to Start Seeds Indoors

In Zone 6, the last frost date typically falls between mid-April and late May. To ensure your flowers are ready for transplanting after the frost has passed, start seeds 6-8 weeks before the last expected frost date. This means you should begin the indoor seed-starting process in early to mid-

lighting, moisture requirements, and even March. Here is a list of popular flowers: Annuals like marigolds, zinnias, and cosmos, Perennials such as echinacea, delphiniums, and Shasta daisies, Biennials like foxgloves and hollyhocks.

FIREMAN MARK SAYS...

As we welcome the warmer weather, I hope you and your family have inspected your smoke AND Carbon Monoxide (CO) detectors to ensure they are in proper working order, and not expired-most smoke detectors and CO detectors are good for 10 years. As we enjoy this warmer weather, be sure to remember to monitor the possibility for severe weather. As we have seen last year severe weather can strike any time of year and anywhere in our region. Here are some tips to keep you safe in the event of severe weather:

- Have a weather radio or a weather alert app on your smart phone (make sure it is charged!)
- Have a tornado emergency plan including a 'safe shelter,' your safe shelter should be the in the basement or an inside room without windows on the lowest floor (bathroom, closet, center hallway). Do not stay in a mobile home.
- Have an emergency kit, with a supply of water, and non-perishable food located in your safe shelter area
- Know the difference between a tornado warning and a tornado watch:
 - o Tornado Warning: means a tornado has been sighted and may be approaching. Seek shelter immediately!

- o Tornado Watch: means there is a possibility of one or more tornadoes in your area. Continue normal activity but monitor weather conditions closely.
- Listen for the storm sirens, the storm sirens are tested the first Wednesday of every month at noon.
- Kenton County's Storm Warning Sirens are activated when:
- o A Tornado Warning is issued for Kenton County by the National Weather Service (siren will be activated again if a credible report of a funnel cloud is witnessed)
- o A credible report of a funnel cloud or tornado
- o The sirens may be activated for other emergencies, such as a hazardous materials leak
- o Please be sure to have multiple ways to receive warnings and not solely rely on the sirens
- o In the event of hearing the storm siren tune in to local media for further information

Councilman Barlage's Edgewood History Notes

Awaiting the green light at Kenton Lands Road and Dixie Highway, I see the façade of the new Kroger approaching completion. The parcel of property now 16 acres was once a sprawling 28 acres back when Barney Kroger first started his company in 1883. At that time, the Lexington Turnpike (Dixie Highway) was rural. In the 1880s George & Helena Lubbers lived in a frame house on this property with their 2 daughters Mary and Margaret. George was from Evenkamp, Germany and farmed this 28-acre parcel (Future Kroger). His next-door neighbors Ann Straub 71 and her sister Frances Butler 80 were of Irish descent and ran a 22-acre farm with Ann's 3 children (Think Bargain Hunt). George Lubbers passed away in 1889 and his wife 7 years later. In October of 1896 the Lubbers' "elegant country residence" on the Lexington Pike was sold via auction to John W. Pratt for the grand sum of \$5,000!
