



FIREMAN MARK SAYS... *by Firefighter Mark Messmer*

Hopefully, everyone remembered to change the batteries or replace your old smoke detectors back in March when moving the clocks forward. If not, it isn't too late, so do it now!

I'd like to touch base on "Planning an Escape" from your home in case of a fire:

- **MAKE** a home escape plan. Draw a map showing the doors/windows and discuss with family members.
- **KNOW** at least 2 ways out of every room, if possible. Practice using different ways out.
- **HAVE** an outside meeting place (tree, light pole, mailbox, neighbor's house), a safe distance from the home, and preferably in the front yard.
- **PRACTICE** your home fire drill at night and during the day at least twice a year
- **TEACH** children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- **CLOSE** doors behind you as you leave. This is very important to slow down fire spread.



IF THE ALARM SOUNDS...

- If the smoke alarm sounds, **GET OUT AND STAY OUT**. Never go back inside for people, pets, or anything. Only firefighters go into a house with smoke/fire.
- If you have to escape through smoke, **GET LOW** and **GO** under the smoke to your way out.
- **CALL 911** (Fire Department) from outside your home.

Edge of the Woods Garden Club News



Ah, springtime—the season when visions of vibrant blooms dance in every gardener's head! But before you grab your trowel and rush into the garden, let's talk about a common gardening blunder: planting annuals in **wet soil** or when the **soil temperature** is below 55°F.

Imagine you're a plant—your roots are your lifeline, you rely on soil to deliver the essentials: nutrients, water, and most importantly, oxygen. Yes, oxygen! The stoma (like lungs on the underside of leaves) are responsible for the exchange of gases for respiration and photosynthesis. Contrary to popular belief, plants don't just breathe through their leaves; their roots need a steady supply of oxygen too. So, overly wet soil can cause something like suffocating! When soil is saturated, air pockets disappear, turning your flower bed into an anaerobic (lack of free oxygen) swamp.

Why Wet or Cold Soil is a Plant's Nightmare

Therefore, roots can't absorb oxygen properly = Sad plant.

Now let's talk temperature. **Soil below 55°F is no friend to annual flowers.** Think of it like trying to nap on a cold marble floor; it's very uncomfortable and non-productive. Cold soil slows down biological processes, making it hard for roots to absorb water and nutrients efficiently.

The Science of Roots and Soil Synergy

Roots need two things to thrive: soil that drains well and ample space for air exchange (plenty of organic matter). In technical terms, plants rely on soil's porosity—the ability to hold both water and oxygen without drowning their

delicate root systems. Soggy soil and cold temperatures create an environment ripe for root rot and **fungal infections** which leave your flowers gasping for air and nutrients.

In summary, give your plants the oxygen-rich, well-drained, and warm soil they need, and they'll thank you with blooms that make your garden the envy of the neighborhood. Ahhhh....now for that dose of patience!

NOTE: A huge Thank You to our new Edgewood resident, Michelle Myfelt, who graciously donated 150 new Daffodil bulbs to the garden club last autumn. The bulbs were planted throughout the city by garden club members and were appreciated by all this Spring!

One of the most effective ways to prevent theft is by locking your home and car! It sounds simple, but the vast majority of thefts occur due to unlocked doors and windows. It doesn't take much time for someone to take valuables or cause damage within a vehicle or home. Read below for other small actions you can take that add up to a safer, more secure neighborhood for everyone.



For vehicles, always lock doors, close windows, and avoid leaving valuables in plain view. Park in well-lit areas, never leave your car running unattended, be sure to bring your keys or key fob inside with you, and use anti-theft devices when possible. For the home, be sure to lock doors and windows, and consider installing deadbolts, using motion-activated lights, trimming overgrown shrubs near entryways, and setting light timers when away. Avoid hiding spare keys outside and think about installing a security system or video doorbell. And, always secure firearms in a locked safe or cabinet!
